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SECTION 1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 PURPOSE

Fulton County, Georgia ("County") is seeking proposals from qualified firms to provide Residential Water and Sewer Service Line Protection Program for Fulton County.

Through the issuance of this Request for Proposal ("RFP" and/or "Proposals"), the County is soliciting Proposals from qualified Proposers for the integrated mosquito management service.

Proposals provided in response to this RFP that comply with the submittal requirements set forth in Section 4.0, including all forms and certifications, will be evaluated in accordance with the criteria and procedures described in Section 5.0. 1.2 DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

The purpose of this solicitation is to procure the best insurance value for Fulton County in accordance with specifications and documents herein for acquiring a Voluntary Residential Water and Sewer Service Line Protection Program for Fulton County Department of Water Resources (DWR).

1.3 BACKGROUND

Many of the County's residential water service and sewer lateral lines are several decades old and are failing with an increased risk of failure with continuing age. By County regulations, homeowners are responsible for repairs of their water service and sewer lateral lines under their property, which most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover. When service lines do fail, which is usually without warning, repairs need to be made immediately and homeowners are faced with the challenges of finding qualified contractors and paying for work out of pocket. Repairs can easily cost thousands of dollars and may require heavy equipment and special permits. It is for the above reasons that it is estimated that the County will benefit significantly with the establishment of a service line protection program for the County's water and sewer customers. Water service line material and configuration will be varied and dependent on the age of the building located on the private property and the building code in place at the time of construction

Currently DWR is responsible for delivering drinking water to approximately 69,485 residential accounts and 2595 commercial water accounts. Approximately, 89,850 sewer accounts are within the County.

County will not provide a list of customer accounts as the successful proposer will have to obtain all relevant information on their own.

1.4 COUNTY OBJECTIVES

The primary goals and objectives of offering a Residential Service Line Repair Program in Fulton County include:

1. The ability to deliver a product package that will meet the needs of our residential customers and provide them with an affordable solution for costly and unexpected water service and sewer lateral line repairs.
2. Ensuring that protection against the significant, unexpected costs of repairing or replacing has been made available to them.
3. Minimizing damage to surrounding streets and infrastructure, and reduce the cost to customers and the County by ensuring highly qualified contractors, which will adhere to state and local codes, perform necessary work on customer water service and sewer lateral lines.
4. Educating customers on their responsibilities regarding service line maintenance and repair.
5. Minimize the impacts to homeowners, neighbors and the County's wastewater collection system from improperly functioning water services and sewer laterals.

1.5 OBTAINING THE RFP

1.6 SUBCONTRACTING OPPORTUNITIES

1.7 PRE-PROPOSAL CONFERENCE

The County will hold a Pre-Proposal Conference, on **August 21, 2014 at 10:00 A.M.**, in the Bid Conference Room of the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Fulton County Public Safety Building, Suite 1168, 130 Peachtree

Street, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia 30303. Attendance at the Pre-Proposal Conference is voluntary for responding to this RFP; however Proposers are encouraged to attend. The purpose of the Pre-Proposal Conference is to provide information regarding the project and to address any questions and concerns regarding the services sought by the County through this RFP.

1.8 PROPOSAL DUE DATE

All proposals are due in the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance of Fulton County located in the Public Safety Building, Suite 1168, 130 Peachtree St, S.W., Atlanta Georgia 30303 on or before **September 9, 2014 at 11:00 A.M.**, legal prevailing time. All submitted proposals shall be time and date stamped according to the clock at the front desk of the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance. Any proposals received after this appointed schedule will be considered late and will be returned unopened to the Proposer. The proposal due date can be changed only by addendum.

1.9 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

It shall be the sole responsibility of the Proposer to have his/her proposal delivered to the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance for receipt on or before the above stipulated due date and time. If a proposal is sent by U.S. Mail, the proposer shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance.

1.10 CONTACT PERSON AND INQUIRIES

Any questions or suggestions regarding this RFP shall be submitted in writing to the Purchasing Department contact person, AlMicah Phillips, Assistant Purchasing Agent, email: almicah.phillips@fultoncountyga.gov. Fax 404-893-1736. Any response made by the County shall be provided in writing to all Proposers by addendum. No verbal responses shall be authoritative.

SECTION 2 INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

2.1 PROCUREMENT PROCESS

The procurement will be on a formally advertised basis. All technical requirements, unless otherwise specified, must be met, or be capable of being met by the Proposer or their proposal will be disqualified as being non-responsive.

2.2 CONTRACT DEFINITIONS

In addition to any other terms that may be defined in this solicitation, the following terms have the following meaning:

Addendum – Revision to the RFP documents issued by the County prior to the receipt of proposals.

Agreement – refers to the executed contract between the County and Contracting Entity.

County – Fulton County Government and its authorized representatives.

Contact Person – Purchasing staff designated by the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance to submit any questions and suggestions to.

Offeror – the entity of individual submitting a proposal in response to this RFP.

Owner – Fulton County Government

Proposal – the document submitted by the offeror in response to this RFP.

Proposer – the entity or individual submitting a proposal in response to his RFP.

Request for Proposal (RFP) – all documents, whether attached or incorporated by reference, utilized for soliciting sealed proposals.

Responsible Offeror – A person or entity that has the capability in all respects to perform fully and reliably the contract requirements.

Responsive Offeror – A person or entity that has submitted a bid or proposal that conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the invitation for bids or request for proposals.

Scope of Work – All the services specified, indicated, shown, or contemplated by the Contract, and furnishing by the Contractor of all materials, equipment, labor, methods, processes, construction and manufacturing materials and equipment, tools, plants, supplies, power, water, transportation and other things necessary to complete such services in accordance with the Contract.

Subcontractor/sub-consultant – An individual, firm, corporation or any combination thereof, having a direct contract with Consultant/Contractor for the performance of a part of the work.

Contractor Network - A network of contractors to be hired by the successful proposer that will carry out the Warranty Services identified in this RFP.

Warranty Plans - Water service, sewer lateral plans sold to the residential property owners within the County as a result of this RFP.

Residential Property Owners - mean those registered owners of property within the geographical boundaries of the County that are either connected to the County's water system, the County's sewer system or both and specifically excludes commercial property owners and tenants living in residential properties. Where a property is of mixed use, which includes a residential element, properties will be eligible for sewer lateral warranty services where the sewer lateral does not exceed 6 inches in diameter and for water service warranty services where the water service does not exceed 2 inches in diameter.

Sewer Lateral - The drain pipe extending from a property to the main sewer which is typically located in the roadway (note: Fulton County code defines the sewer later as the home-owners responsibility, and the sewer lateral is the pipe with extends from the sewer main to the property, which can include sections of pipe located within roadways). (**See Attachment 1**)

Closed-Circuit Television - (CCTV) The use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors.

Warranty Service Provider - An organization or entity which has previous experience in providing Warranty Plans and the administration of Warranty Services for a County of similar size to that of the Fulton County.

Warranty Services - The performance of those repair, maintenance, replacement and restoration services covered under the Warranty Plans sold to the Residential Property Owner as a result of this RFP.

Water Service - The water pipe connected to the water main distribution system which is designed to convey water from this system to a property. The property owner is responsible for the portion located between the building and property line/meter. This is the portion of the water pipe which shall be covered under the Warranty Services sought in this RFP. The County will assume responsibility for

all repairs to the water pipe from the property line to the water main which is not as a result of work completed under the Warranty Services. (**See Attachment 2**)

Fulton County Water and Sewer Service Areas - (**See Attachment 3**)

County Residential Customers - Single family dwellings, condominiums (with separate unit services), town homes and duplexes.

2.3 NO CONTACT DURING PROCUREMENT PROCESS

It is the policy of Fulton County that the evaluation and award process for County contracts shall be free from both actual and perceived impropriety, and that contacts between potential vendors and County officials, elected officials and staff regarding pending awards of County contracts shall be prohibited.

- A. No person, firm, or business entity, however situated or composed, obtaining a copy of or responding to this solicitation, shall initiate or continue any verbal or written communication regarding this solicitation with any County officer, elected official, employee, or designated County representative, between the date of the issuance of this solicitation and the date of the County Manager's recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for award of the subject contract, except as may otherwise be specifically authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation.
- B. All verbal and written communications initiated by such person, firm, or entity regarding this solicitation, if same are authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation, shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.
- C. Any violation of this prohibition of the initiation or continuation of verbal or written communications with County officers, elected officials, employees, or designated County representatives shall result in a written finding by the Purchasing Agent that the submitted bid or proposal of the person, firm, or entity in violation is "non-responsive", and same shall not be considered for award.

2.4 CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA

Proposers may submit requests for clarifications or interpretations regarding this RFP and the Contract. Proposers must prepare such requests in writing for the County's consideration as set forth in this section of this RFP. While the County has not placed an initial limitation on the number of requests which can be submitted, Proposers are cautioned that if Proposers do not request meaningful clarifications or interpretations in an organized manner (e.g., limited frequency of requests), the County will set restrictions on the frequency and number of requests permitted. The County will not respond to requests, oral or written,

received after **August 26, 2014 at 5:00 P.M.**, local prevailing time. Proposers are advised that this section places no obligation on the part of the County to respond to any or all requests for clarification or interpretation, and that the County's failure to respond to any such request will not relieve the Proposer of any obligations or conditions required by this RFP.

All responses to written requests for clarification, interpretation, or additional information will be distributed as addenda to this RFP and posted on the Fulton County website www.fultoncountyga.gov.

No oral interpretation, instruction, or information concerning this RFP given by any employee or agent of the County shall be binding on the County. Proposers who submit a Proposal in reliance on any such oral information risk having their response to this RFP deemed non-responsive by the County. Only written responses issued by addendum to this RFP should be considered by the Proposers.

During the period provided for the preparation of Proposals, the County may issue addenda to this RFP. These addenda will be numbered consecutively and will be posted on the Fulton County website, www.fultoncountyga.gov. These addenda will be issued by, or on behalf of, the County and will constitute a part of this RFP. Each Proposer is required to acknowledge receipt of each addendum by submitting an executed acknowledgment form. This acknowledgment shall include all addenda distributed prior to the Proposal Submission Date. All responses to this RFP shall be prepared with full consideration of the addenda issued prior to the Proposal Submission Date.

2.5 TERM OF CONTRACT

The initial term of the contract shall be for a five year term with one, (1) two (2) year renewal options.

2.6 RFP SUBMITTALS

See **Exhibit 1** for the RFP Submittal Checklist. This checklist will assist you to ensure that all submittals are included in your proposal. Failure to submit all submittals may deem your proposal non-responsive.

2.7 PROPOSAL EVALUATION

All proposals will be evaluated using the criteria specified in Section 4 of this RFP. Selection will include an analysis of proposals by a Vendor Selection Committee composed of County personnel who will review the proposal submittals in accordance with the submittal requirements and the evaluation criteria set forth in Section 4 of this RFP. The committee may request oral interviews and/or site visits. Awards will not necessarily be based on cost alone. Other factors, as detailed in the RFP, will be considered in determining what proposal will be deemed to best meet the needs of Fulton County.

2.8 DISQUALIFICATION OF PROPOSERS

The submission of more than one (1) proposal to the County as the primary Proposer or member of a joint venture for the same work by an individual firm, partnership or corporation under the same or different names may be grounds for disqualification of a Proposer and the rejection of the proposal.

2.9 RESERVED RIGHTS

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response that is received may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. There is no obligation on the part of the County to award the contract to the lowest proposer and the County reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible proposers submitting responsive proposals with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the County. The County shall be the sole judge of the proposals and the resulting agreements that are in its best interest and its decision shall be final. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any proposer to perform the work or service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the proposer. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to, current financial statements by an independent CPA; verification of availability of personnel; and past performance records.

2.10 APPLICABLE LAWS

All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Georgia and ordinances and regulations of Fulton County shall apply. Protestors shall seek resolution of their complaints in the manner provided in the Fulton County Code of Laws §2-324 which is incorporated by reference herein.

2.11 MINIMUM PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIME CONTRACTORS

Pursuant to Fulton County Code 102-357, Prime Bidders on the project must perform no less than 51% of the scope of work required under the project.

2.12 INSURANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS

Insurance and Risk Management provisions and Indemnification and Hold Harmless provisions are outlined in Section 7 of this RFP.

2.13 ACCURACY OF RFP AND RELATED DOCUMENTS

The County assumes no responsibility that the specified technical and background information presented in this RFP, or otherwise distributed or made available during this procurement process, is complete or accurate. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the County will not be bound by or be responsible for any explanation or interpretation of the Proposal documents other than those given in writing as an addendum to this RFP.

Should a recipient of this RFP find discrepancies in or omissions from this RFP and related documents, the recipient of this RFP shall immediately notify the Purchasing Contact Person identified in Section 1.11 in writing at the following address: Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Public Safety Bldg., 130 Peachtree Street S.W., Suite 1168 Atlanta, GA 30303. A written addendum, if necessary, then will be made available to each recipient of this RFP.

2.14 RESPONSIBILITY OF PROPOSER

Each Proposer is encouraged to conduct all necessary investigations and review all available and relevant data and information, which are necessary in its judgment in order to assume this responsibility prior to the submittal of its Proposal. Proposers are reminded of Fulton County's "**No Contact During Procurement**" policy and shall only contact the person designated by the RFP.

2.15 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

If any Proposal contains technical, financial, or other confidential information that the Proposer believes is exempt from disclosure, the Proposer must clearly label the specific portions sought to be kept confidential and specify on what the exemption is based. The County, at its sole discretion and subject to applicable

law, will determine whether such exemption applies. The County has sole discretion to make such determination regarding the disclosure of information, and by responding to this RFP, Proposers waive any challenge to the County's decisions in this regard. Marking all or substantially all of a Proposal as confidential may result in the Proposer being deemed non-responsive to this RFP.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Proposers recognize and agree that the County, its staff, and its Consultants will not be responsible or liable in any way for any losses that the Proposer may suffer from the disclosure of information or materials to third parties.

2.16 COUNTY RIGHTS AND OPTIONS

This RFP constitutes an invitation to submit Proposals to the County. Without limitation or penalty, the County reserves and holds at its sole discretion, the following rights and options:

- This RFP does not obligate the County to select, procure or contract for any services whatsoever.
- Fulton County reserves the right to award a contract based on this RFP and the proposal(s) received (in whole or in part) to one or several vendors.
- The County reserves the right to change or alter the schedule for any events associated with this procurement and, if required, notify the Proposers. A Proposer, by submitting a Proposal, agrees to be bound by any modifications made by the County
- All costs incurred by a Proposer in connection with responding to this RFP, the evaluation and selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any negotiations with the County will be borne by the Proposer.
- The County reserves the right to reject all Proposals and components thereof to eliminate all Proposers responding to this RFP from further consideration for this procurement, and to notify such Proposers of the County's determination.
- The County may cancel this RFP without the substitution of another RFP and terminate this procurement at any time without any liability whatsoever.
- The County reserves the right to waive any technicalities or irregularities in the Proposals.

- The County reserves the right to eliminate any Proposer who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this RFP.
- The County may request Proposers to send representatives to the County for interviews and presentations.
- To the extent deemed appropriate by the County, the County may select and enter into discussion and negotiations with the Proposer(s) submitting Proposal(s), which are found to be reasonably susceptible for award.
- The County reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any selected Proposer.
- The County reserves the right, without prior notice, to supplement, amend, or otherwise modify this RFP.
- All Proposals (other than portions thereof subject to patent or copyright protection) become the property of the County and will not be returned, and the County reserves the right to utilize all such information contained in the Proposals without further cost to the County
- The County may add to or delete from the Project Scope of Work set forth in this RFP.
- Any and all Proposals not received by the Proposal Submission Date shall be rejected and returned unopened.
- Neither the County, its staff, its representatives, nor any of its consultants or attorneys will be liable for any claims or damages resulting from the solicitation, collection, review, or evaluation of responses to this RFP.
- The County, including its representatives and consultants, reserves the right to visit and examine any of the facilities referenced in any Proposal and to observe and investigate the operations of such facilities.

By responding to this RFP, Proposers acknowledge and consent to the rights and conditions set forth in this RFP.

2.17 COST OF PROPOSAL PREPARATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Each Proposal, including preparation of all information required to be included in a Proposal pursuant to this RFP, shall be prepared at the sole cost and expense (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) of the Proposer. In addition, the Proposer shall be solely responsible for all costs (including engineering and legal costs) incurred by such Proposer in connection with this selection process, including any costs incurred by the Proposer in any

subsequent negotiations entered into in connection with developing the Proposal. There shall be no claims whatsoever against the County, its staff, or its consultants for reimbursement for the costs or expenses (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) incurred during the preparation of the Proposal or other information required by this RFP or procurement process or in connection with the selection process or any negotiations.

2.18 TERMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS

The County at its sole discretion may, at any time, to the extent permitted by Applicable Law, exclude a Proposer from further participation in any negotiation process if the County determines that such Proposer is failing to progress in the negotiations or if the terms of its Proposal are less advantageous than those of other Proposers and such Proposer is deemed to be no longer susceptible of selection. The County will give written notice of its decision to the Proposer, which shall be sent in writing, signed by the County.

2.19 WAGE CLAUSE

Pursuant to 102-391, Each Contractor shall agree that in the performance of the Contract he will comply with all lawful agreements, if any, which the Contractor had made with any association, union, or other entity, with respect to wages, salaries, and working conditions, so as not to cause inconvenience, picketing, or work stoppage.

2.20 ADDITIONAL OR SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

After receipt of the submittals, the County will evaluate the responses, including the references, financial statements, experience and other data relating to the Respondent's qualifications. If requested by the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Respondent's maybe required to submit additional or supplemental information to determine whether the Respondent meets all of the qualification requirements.

2.21 REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES

The successful Proposer will report directly to the Paul Williams, or designated representative.

2.22 GEORGIA SECURITY AND IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE ACT

This Request for Proposal is subject to the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act. Pursuant to the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act of 2006, as amended on May 11, 2009, bidders and proposers are notified that all bids/proposals for services that are to be physically performed within the State of Georgia must be accompanied by proof of their registration with and continuing and future participation in the E-Verify program established by the United States Department of Homeland Security. A completed affidavit must be submitted on the top of the bid/proposal at the time of submission, prior to the

time for opening bids/proposals. Under state law, the County cannot consider any bid/proposal which does not include a completed affidavit. It is not the intent of this notice to provide detailed information or legal advice concerning the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act. All bidders/proposers intending to do business with the County are responsible for independently apprising themselves and complying with the requirements of that law and its effect on County procurements and their participation in those procurements. 2.23 AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSACT BUSINESS

If the Proposer is a Georgia corporation, the corporation, prior to contract execution, shall submit documentary evidence from the Secretary of State that the Corporation is in good standing and that the corporation is authorized to transact business in the State of Georgia.

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If the Proposer is a foreign (non-Georgia) corporation, the corporation, prior to contract execution shall submit a Certificate of Authority and documentary evidence from the Georgia Secretary of State of good standing which reflects that the corporation is authorized to do business in the State of Georgia.

2.24 RIGHT TO PROTEST

Any actual bidder or offeror who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract shall protest in writing to the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance. An actual bidder or offeror is defined as a person or entity who has submitted a bid or proposal on the project for which they are filing a protest. A protest shall be submitted to and received by the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance in writing within 14 days after such aggrieved entity known or should have known of the solicitation, the award of contract to another or other acts giving rise to a protest. An oral protest or a protest to an official, employee, User Department, or other person apart from the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance does not comply.

2.25 FIRST SOURCE JOBS POLICY

It is the policy of Fulton County Government to provide employment opportunities to the citizens of Fulton County. This policy will apply to all contracts procured through the Department of Purchasing & Contract Compliance valued in excess of \$200,000. The Prime Contract is expected to utilize the First Source Jobs Program to fill 50% of the entry level jobs which arise as a result of any project funded in whole or in part with County funds with residents of Fulton County. Forms are provided in Section 6 of this RFP.

2.26 NON-COLLUSION

By submitting a signed proposal, Offeror certifies that there has been no collusion with any other Offeror. Reasonable grounds for believing Offeror has an interest in more than one proposal will result in rejection of all proposals in which the Offeror has an interest. Any party to collusion may not be considered in future proposals for the same or similar work. See Section 5, Proposal Forms for declarations and affidavits.

2.27 EXCEPTIONS TO THE COUNTY'S CONTRACT

If Offeror takes exception to any term or condition set forth in the Sample Contract, see Section 8 of this RFP, and any of its exhibits, appendices or attachments, said exceptions must be clearly identified in the response to this RFP. Exceptions or modifications to any of the terms and conditions must be submitted as a separate document accompanying the Offeror's proposal clearly marked as "Exceptions."

The County shall be the sole determiner of the acceptability of any exception. See Section 5, Proposal Forms for declarations and affidavits.

2.28 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Proposals may be withdrawn upon receipt of a written request prior to the stated due date and time. If a firm seeks to withdraw a proposal after the due date and time, the firm must present a notarized statement indicating that an error was made, with an explanation of how it occurred. The withdrawal request must be accompanied by documentation supporting the claim. Prior to approving or disapproving the request, an opinion will be obtained from Fulton County's Legal Counsel indicating whether the firm is bound by its proposal.

Proposals for projects that are solicited pursuant to the Georgia Local Government Public Works Construction Law (O.C.G.A. § 36-91-1 et seq.) may be withdrawn as follows:

The County must advise Offerors in the request for proposals of the number of days that Offerors will be required to honor their proposals. If an Offeror is not selected within 60 days of opening the proposals, any Offeror that is determined by the governmental entity to be unlikely of being selected for contract award will be released from the proposal.

2. Fulton County shall be the sole judge of the quality and the applicability of all proposals. Design, features, overall quality, local facilities, terms and other pertinent considerations will be taken into account in determining acceptability.
3. The successful Offeror must assume full responsibility for delivery of all

goods and services proposed.

4. The successful Offeror must assume full responsibility for replacement of all defective or damaged goods and/or performance of contracted services within thirty (30) days notice by the County of such defect, damage or deficiency.
5. The successful Offeror must assume full responsibility for providing warranty service on all goods, materials, or equipment provided to the County with warranty coverage. Should a vendor be other than the manufacturer, the vendor and not the County is responsible for contacting the manufacturer. The Offeror is solely responsible for arranging for the service to be performed.
6. The successful Offeror shall be responsible for the proper training and certification of personnel used in the performance of the services proposed.
7. The successful Offeror shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of any contract resulting from the RFP or of any of its rights, title or interest therein without prior written consent of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners.
8. In case of default by the successful Offeror, Fulton County may procure the articles or services from another source and hold the successful Vendor responsible for any resultant excess cost.
9. All proposals and bids submitted to Fulton County are subject to the Georgia "Open Records Act", Official Code of Georgia, Annotated (O.C.G.A.) § 50-18-70 et seq.
10. All proposals and bids submitted to Fulton County involving Utility Contracting are subject to the Georgia law governing licensing of Utility Contractors, O.C.G.A. §43-14-8.2(h).

SECTION 3 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

3.1 SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Proposal shall consist of a Technical Proposal, a Cost Proposal and all documents listed on the Required Submittal Checklist (Exhibit 1). The Technical Proposal shall include proposer information, technical information, business-related information, and any Technical Proposal forms requested. The Cost Proposal shall include the Cost Proposal Forms and any information describing the basis for pricing and must be separately, sealed, marked and packaged.

The required content of the Technical Proposal and Cost Proposal is further specified in this section of the RFP. The Proposal must be signed and acknowledged by the Proposer, including certain information to be provided under oath as required under applicable law, in accordance with the instructions herein and the various proposal forms.

THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL, THE COST PROPOSAL AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE EXHIBITS SHALL BE SUBMITTED IN SEPARATE, SEALED ENVELOPES OR PACKAGES. THE INCLUSION OF ANY COST INFORMATION IN THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL MAY RESULT IN SUCH PROPOSAL BEING REJECTED BY THE COUNTY.

Financial Information, one (1) original with the Technical Proposal marked "Original" and one (1) copy in a separate sealed envelope.

Cost Proposal, one (1) original and one (1) copy in a separate sealed envelope.

All Proposals must be complete with all requested information.

3.2 OVERVIEW OF PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Proposers shall submit Proposals in accordance with the content and format requirements set forth in this RFP. Proposals should be clearly organized and structured in a manner that allows materials included in the document to be located easily.

Each of the instructions set forth in this section must be followed for a Proposal to be deemed responsive to this RFP. In all cases, the County reserves the right to determine, at its sole discretion, whether any aspect of the Proposal meets the requirements set forth in this section. The County reserves the right to reject any Proposal, which in its judgment, does not comply with these Proposal submission requirements.

3.3 SCOPE OF WORK

The successful Provider will provide residential water and sewer service line protection Program throughout Fulton County. The following describes the various task associated with this project.

A. During the term the selected Provider will be required to deliver a Residential Water and Sewer Service Line Protection Program that provides coverage for the cost of repair and/or replacement of the residential customer's water and sewer service line as defined herein and meet the needs of the County's customers.

B. It is the County's expectation that the Provider will use their expertise to customize the Scope of Work in order to improve the overall program's ability to meet the program goals.

C. The scope of work, at a minimum, shall include:

1. Coverage: Provide coverage for repair and/or replacement of the residential customer's water and sewer service lines and interior plumbing and drainage, as well as labor and materials to complete all repairs and/or replacement including basic site restoration such as backfilling, raking

and reseeding, and/or replacement of concrete walkway and pavement as necessary. Minimum coverage shall include:

- a. Coverage for the cost of repair and/or replacement of residential water service line from the meter to the house and sewer lateral lines from the main line through the property line/cleanout to the residence; tear, defects in materials, freezing and earth movement;
 - b. Base coverage to repair leaks, blockages, and breaks due to normal wear and tear, defects in materials, freezing and earth movement;
 - c. Shall optimize value of Program to customers by recommending coverage limits and enrollment cost to customers;
 - d. No requirement for customer to pay for service call charges, deductibles or pre- inspections;
 - e. Guaranteed emergency response times within two (2) hours, including schedule of repair with customer and repair contractor.
 - f. Cost of acquiring permits, if required.
 - g. Basic site restoration describing extent of coverage for restoration of hardscape, Landscape, driveways and sidewalks;
 - h. It is preferred that inspection of the resident's water and/or service line or plumbing facilities not be required as a pre-request for enrollment in the Program. However, the selected Provider may institute a waiting period from the start of the customer's service contract prior to the honoring the first claim(s) for service.
 - i. All warranty plans on a strictly optional opt-in basis.
 - j. Water Service warranty protection plan coverage shall not contain exclusion clauses relating to pre-existing conditions or the age of the property.
 - k. Sewer Lateral warranty protection plan coverage shall not contain exclusion clauses relating to pre-existing conditions or the age of the property.
 - l. The waiting period shall not exceed 30 calendar days for claim submittal after enrollment.
2. Repair Service(s): Provide qualified reputable professional plumbers to perform the repairs or replacement of the water and sewer service line. The plumbers must meet the following requirements:

- a. The plumbing Contractor must be licensed from the State of Georgia and an approved vendor to do business in Fulton County.
 - b. The on-site plumbing Contractor must have a valid and active plumbing license from the State of Georgia. A licensed plumber must be present at all times to direct activities and perform all work that requires a licensed plumber and when multiple licensed and/or unlicensed workers are assigned to a job.
 - c. In cases where the qualifying leak or failure occurs on a customer service line that is galvanized pipe, that customer's service line shall be replaced in its entirety by the responding contractor with type K copper or equivalent approved pipe.
 - d. All plumbing Contractors must be bonded and insured.
 - e. All plumbing work must be in compliance with all State and Local codes.
 - f. Provider guarantees that all contractors assigned to the County will be qualified and licensed plumbers and approved County vendors.
3. Administration/Billing: Minimum administration and billing services shall include:
- a. All phases of program administration including customer requests for service repairs, enrollment options, billing, billing inquiries, customer complaints and service cancellation.
 - b. An appointed Provider employee as the key contact/representative for the County' account.
 - c. Provider maintained customer enrollment information and the provision of current enrollment information to the County at a required frequency.
 - d. Provider managed process of enrollment, billing, notification and collection of delinquent Program fees.
4. Customer Service: Minimum customer services shall include:
- a. A toll-free customer service telephone number available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with live staff for all customer claims, inquiries, application for service, customer billing and non-emergency calls, etc.
 - b. Guaranteed response times within two (2) hours, including schedule of repair with customer and repair contractor.
5. Marketing: Minimum marketing services shall include:

- a. Provide a marketing plan that is directed at all County residential customers. All marketing materials must be pre-approved by the County.
- b. Provider must pay for all marketing design and production costs for brochures, flyers, press releases, other marketing needs and the Provider must pay for all mailing materials and postage costs incurred.
- e. Provider is strictly prohibited from selling, trading or in any way distributing the County's customer contact information to any entity or individual not associated directly with the provisions of this Program.
- f. Provider marketing activities involving telemarketing and/or door-to-door solicitation are strictly prohibited.

6. Quality Assurance:

Minimum quality assurance services shall include:

- a. Provider and contracted plumbing Contractors must have quality assurance program/procedures in-place.
 - b. Upon County request, within thirty calendar days, provide customer service, dis-patch, enrollment, quality assurance and customer satisfaction reports, including but not limited to, customer information and counts, quantity of successful repairs, service provided, plumbing Contractors and crew members assigned to projects and other information crucial to quality assurance and control.
 - c. Provider shall perform contractor job oversight, including but not limited to, honest reporting, customer satisfaction and high quality workmanship.
7. Liability and Warranty: Provider assumes all liability for services provided and provides a warranty, at least one year, for all services and materials provided by contractor for service line repair or replacement work.

8. Contractor Network

The successful provider shall establish a Contractor Network sufficient in size to meet all requests for Warranty Services made by enrolled Residential Property Owners. The successful Provider shall establish a Contractor Network that is sufficient in size and scope to compensate for any disruptions to Warranty Services due to disputes with a contractor. The County will not intervene in any disputes or disagreements between the successful provider and its Contractor Network.

9. CCTV Requirements

The successful provider shall ensure that CCTV technology is used with respect to the inspection of Sewer Laterals in its delivery of Warranty Services contemplated under this RFP. CCTV equipment used for such inspections shall be capable of providing a precise locate of a Sewer Lateral at any given time during the inspection.

The successful provider shall ensure that it or its subcontractor, at the County's request, shall submit to the County sketches and/or video recordings of CCTV results. Sketches shall clearly illustrate the located Sewer Lateral in relation to its proximity to the serviced building. Minimum information to be identified on sketches include building; property line (p/l); mainline sewer; measurements; defects and/or blockages

A measurement must be shown on sketches indicating the distance from the clean-out (and/or point of camera entry) to the foundation wall where the Sewer Lateral exits the building.

The successful provider shall ensure that all CCTV video recordings of Sewer Lateral inspections submitted to the County shall be in MPEG-1 format and delivered in a labeled protective hard plastic case.

10. Payment Schedule - Administrative Compensation Fee

a. For exclusive rights to establish and provide a Residential Water Service and Sewer Lateral Line Protection Program for County customers, the successful Proposer shall pay the County a quarterly Administrative Compensation Fee based on the number of active customers, both new enrollments and renewing customers during that period.

b. The quarterly Administrative Compensation Fee will be the number of active customers, both new enrollments and renewing customers during that quarterly period for each month times the unit cost bid on the Proposal Price Sheet.

c. The Administrative Compensation Fee shall be submitted quarterly by the Contractor to the designated account by wire transfer.

11. Manner of Payment to County: Administrative Fee payment shall be made to the County quarterly by the 25th of the following month of each quarter-end based on the customers enrolled with the Provider for the months of that quarter with back-up documentation, as a minimum, detailing each customer name and address. The County reserves the right to audit any payment received by requesting all information pertaining to and supporting the payment.

12. Progress Meetings: The successful Provider will be required to meet periodically with the County management staff/program team in Fulton County to discuss the progress in developing, marketing and implementing the program. It is anticipated that these meetings will take place each month for six months from the date of the contract execution, at which point the meetings will take place bi-annually. Meeting minutes will be prepared and distributed to the meeting attendees by the selected Provider within one week after each meeting. Accordingly, please factor the cost of your attendance at these meetings into your proposal.

13. County Mediation and Training

The successful provider shall establish, to the County's satisfaction, a mediation program and protocols to handle circumstances where enrolled Residential Property Owners contact the County directly to inquire about the Warranty Plans or to raise disputes between themselves and the successful provider.

The successful provider shall also provide training to County staff, to the County's satisfaction, with respect to the Warranty Plans it offers and how to address calls received by customers.

14. Quality, Materials and Specifications

The successful provider shall ensure that with respect to performing all Warranty Services contemplated under this RFP and the resulting Warranty Plans, it and its contractors:

Adhere to all applicable, Federal, State and Local environmental and health and safety rules and regulations with respect to performing all Warranty Services;

Perform all Warranty Services pursuant to valid permits and that all such Warranty Services successfully pass any and all required inspections, with the successful provider being expected to cover all expenses related to permit fees and inspections costs;

The successful provider shall also ensure that its Contractor Network leave all job sites in an equal or better state of repair or cleanliness as they were found in, making only those changes necessary to complete the Warranty Services.

The Program offered shall provide coverage for the cost of repair and/or replacement of customer (Customer or Residential) water service line from the meter to the house and sewer service lines from the residence to the sewer main connection, as well as labor and materials to complete all repairs and/or replacement. The selected Provider will be permitted to directly market the program to County customers and enter into policy

agreements with such customers. It is up to the customer to determine if the customer wants to purchase the services from the Provider, and the Provider will be responsible for collection of premiums and remitting payments to contractors.

15. Residential Service Line Repair Insurance Program.

- a. Residential Water Service Lines: The County is interested in selecting a Provider to provide customer water service line protection which will repair or replace leaks or blockage to incoming water service line. Qualifying leaks or failures should be repaired or replaced to good working condition and within County code and accepted plumbing standards by Master Plumbers registered with the State of Georgia. The plan should cover the service line from the connection to the County water meter setting to the main water service shut off valve inside the property and any basic site restoration including backfilling, raking and reseeding; and/or replacement of concrete walkway as necessary. In cases where the qualifying leak or failure occurs on a customer service line that is other than type K copper, that customer's service line should be replaced in its entirety by the responding contractor with type K copper.
- b. Residential Sewer Lateral Lines: The County is interested in selecting a Provider to provide customer sewer lateral line protection to repair broken, damaged, or clogged sewer lateral pipes from the residence sewer lateral to the County's sewer main connection. In most instances, these sewer service lines or sewer laterals are six (6) inches or less in diameter. Plan should include the cost of the investigation, basic site restoration including backfilling, raking and reseeding, and/or replacement of concrete walkway and pavement as necessary. Repairs shall be completed within County code and accepted plumbing standards by certified and approved contractors.
- c. All warranty protection plans shall be on a strictly optional opt-in basis.
- d. Water Service and Sewer Lateral warranty protection plans coverage shall not contain exclusion clauses relating to pre-existing conditions or the age of the property.

3.4 PROJECT DELIVERABLES:

3.4.1 Monitoring & Reporting Requirements: In order to measure and ensure continued success of the Warranty Services, the successful provider shall generate and provide to the County, the following reports:

Detailed monthly reports on the number and nature of calls, details of repairs and replacements, and documentation of all Warranty Services performed;

Detailed monthly reports outlining commission revenues to be received corresponding to customer enrollment;

Customer enrollment, customer satisfaction, services provided, dispatch information, and repair work schedules, to be provided at the County's request; and,

Any other information necessary to assess Warranty Services and customer service quality and control, as determined by the County, to be provided at the County's request.

Monthly reports shall be provided in a consistent timely manner, within 15 calendar days of the month's end or as may be agreed upon during the contract where exceptional circumstances arise.

Requests made by the County shall be fulfilled no later than 15 calendar days from the date of the request. Any requests which are identified by the County as emergency or high priority in nature shall be fulfilled no later than 5 calendar days unless an additional amount of time is specifically agreed upon by the County and the successful provider.

The County shall be entitled to audit any and all information provided in order to verify its accuracy. The County shall provide the successful provider with a minimum of 30 calendar days' notice of its intention to audit and the successful provider shall make available its records in order to facilitate such an audit. Failure to allow such an audit to occur shall constitute a breach of the contract arising from this RFP.

3.4.2. County Provided Items:

- a. Use of County and Department of Water Resources logos only for purposes of co-branding the program's products and services to County residents;
- b. The County requires the Contractor to notify the County of any repairs at any residence under this Program to assure that all lines that are the responsibility of the County are inspected and if necessary, repairs are scheduled.
- c. The County assumes maintenance responsibility for the water service line from the property line/meter to the water main.

3.5 PROJECT SCHEDULE

Upon County request, within thirty calendar days, the successful vendor will provide customer service, dispatch, enrollment, quality assurance and customer satisfaction reports, including but not limited to, customer information and counts,

quantity of successful repairs, service provided, plumbing Contractors and crew members assigned to projects and other information crucial to quality assurance and control.

3.6 TECHNICAL PROPOSAL FORMAT AND CONTENT

The Technical Proposal shall include the appropriate and requested information in sufficient detail to demonstrate the Proposer's knowledge, skills and abilities to provide requested services and will be reviewed and evaluated based on each Proposer's responses to the criteria described below.

The Technical Proposal shall be arranged and include content as described below:

Section 1 - Executive Summary

The executive summary shall include the following information:

1. Provide the legal name of the entity responding to this proposal.
2. Provide the business type of the entity responding to this proposal (i.e. Joint Venture, Partnership, etc).
3. Description of the firm and general background such as ownership, longevity, staff size, main branch of operations location and services provided.
4. Description of the firm's experience with service line repair/protection programs including the total number and location of active utilities currently served through an agreement or other forms of contract.
5. Include a brief statement of approach to the work, understanding of the project's goals and objectives and demonstrated understanding of the project's potential problems and concerns.
6. Name, address and telephone number of one (1) individual to whom all future correspondence and/or communications will be directed.

Section 2 – Project Plan or Project Approach

The Proposer should submit the following information in order to demonstrate their understanding of the tasks identified in the scope of work, and methodology including best practices and benchmarks to be used.

- . Service Plan: Provide detailed information regarding the Residential Service Line Repair Program including, but not limited to, the following:
 1. Plan Coverage - Description of scope of coverage of the proposed Program, including the limit of extent of coverage, coverage amounts (dollar amount covered per claim), limit of claims allowed per customer every subscription year, guaranteed time to respond to customer calls and timeliness of actual repairs/replacements.
 2. Plan Terms - Description of Program terms and conditions, including enrollment procedures and waiting period for coverage to be effective after sign-up, administration of late fees, customer cancellation policy, pre-inspection prerequisite requirements (if any), policy for transfer of coverage to subsequent purchaser of property and overlapping coverage with other homeowner/renter property insurance.
 3. Plan Limitations - Description of Program coverage limitations and exclusions, including repairs or replacements not covered, limits of Provider liability, compliance with local code and County ordinances (i.e. obtain necessary permits), and appeal procedure for denial of coverage.
 4. Plan Overages - Description of procedures for customers if repair exceeds plan coverage limitations (i.e. cost to replace the line exceeds the dollar amount covered per claim).
 5. Plan Warranty- Description of warranty provisions for repair/replacement work performed, including warranty of workmanship and/or materials used, coverage of subsequent repair made to a prior-covered repair, and certification of work performed by licensed plumbing contractors and how the process a customer would follow to request a warranty repair.
 6. Claims - Description of the claims process and average cycle times from claim submission, to the date work is started, to repair completion.
 7. Landscaping - Describe how landscaping, turf restoration, fencing, backfilling, raking and reseeding, and/or replacement of concrete walkway and pavement encountered or re- moved during the repair are handled and if so define any limits that apply.
- B. Customer Service: Provide detailed information on your Customer Service/Call Center including, but not limited to the following:
 1. Description of what customers should expect when a service request is made, including the customer interface (i.e. website, phone number), Provider procedures to handle customer service/claims requests, handling of emergency calls and non-emergency calls, scheduling of repairs and verification of work performed.

2. Emergency repair response times and procedures for handling customer claim calls, including timeframes for contacting customers, and response time for repair contractor to respond on-site. Describe customer interface with Customer Service/Call Center for emergency repair, including customer interface if call is made outside of normal business hours.
 3. Customer Service/Call Center normal business hours to answer calls for all customer non-emergency calls including customer application for service, customer billing, customer inquiries, and customer disputes.
 4. Description of Customer Service/Call Center capabilities such as number of staff to handle the County's customer calls; experience of staff and bilingual language capacity.
 5. Description of customer dispute resolution policy/procedures.
- C. Marketing: Provide detailed information on your anticipated marketing strategy for the county including, but not limited to, the following:

 2. Description of expectation of County's involvement and responsibilities in the marketing process and what is needed from the County to ensure a successful marketing campaign.
 3. Description of how the list of County customers will be obtained and your experience in marketing when no data is provided.
 4. Description of estimated minimum marketing investment by the Provider during each of the first two (2) years.
 5. Describe your marketing staff. Indicate how many people will be dedicated to the County's marketing program and years of marketing experience in a County similar to Fulton County in terms of County age, population and socioeconomic demographics.
 6. Provide an estimate, and details supporting estimate, of the number of customers that can be expected to enroll in the program during each of the first two (2) years and subsequent three (3) years, of total potential contract term.
 7. Provide market penetration that was achieved by your firm for each year for the first two (2) years for two (2) programs in cities similar to Fulton

County in terms of County age, population, and socioeconomic demographics.

D. Quality Assurance: Provide detailed information on your quality assurance program/procedures including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Description of how work on covered service lines will be evaluated.
2. Description of key performance measures of success and customer satisfaction that will be tracked for the Program.
3. Description of policies and procedures to oversee and evaluate contractors work on repairs.
4. Detailed table or matrix identifying all parties responsible for all functions or elements of the County's program, also indicating if they are employed directly by the firm or are a subcontractor.

E. Implementation: Provide a tentative project plan to implement the Program including, but not limited to, the following:

1. A copy of the policy provided to the customer under the Program and any application the customer will be required to submit to sign-up for the Program.
2. Description of what would happen to participating customers if the Program is discontinued (i.e. County contract with Provider not renewed or the Provider goes out of business).

F. Claim History:

1. Recent customer satisfaction ratings for your firm's similar programs and the contractors utilized to perform the work, indicating methods used to measure customer satisfaction.
2. For two (2) existing and/or recent contracts your firm has with cities similar to Fulton County in terms of County age, population, and socioeconomic demographics, for the last two (2) fiscal years, provide:
 - a. Total number of claims;
 - b. Average amount paid per claim;
 - c. Number of claims paid per year;
 - d. Average amount claimed but not paid;
 - e. Number and type of claims rejected on exclusions in coverage; and

f. The percentage of satisfied customers regarding claims management and contractor performance (customer satisfaction rating >90%).

G. Premium Coverage:

1. Description of monetary coverage limits you would propose to offer to County enrolled customers, in terms of the maximum amount per covered incident and per calendar year and individually for both the water and sewer program
2. Proposed billing frequency options to customers
3. Proposed premiums, based on billing frequency, for both the water and sewer programs separately; and what if any bundling discount would be available
4. Description of how long the above premiums would be in place for both the water and sewer programs and how would the need to raise premiums would be handled in the future
5. Identify enhancements to the Program that either reduce cost or add value to the Program

H. Reporting/Samples:

Provide sample copy of policy and all documents that prospective resident customers would be required to execute to enter an agreement with the successful Proposer.

Section 4 - Availability of Key Personnel

- (1) Percentage of time key personnel will spend on this project
- (2) Current workload of key personnel

Section 5 - Local Preference

Local Preference is given to businesses that have a business location within the geographic boundaries of Fulton County. The term business location means that the business has a staffed, fixed, physical place of business located within Fulton County and has had the same for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the business' submission of its proposal or bid, as applicable and has had held a valid business license from Fulton County or a city located within Fulton County for the business at a fixed, physical, place of business, for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the business' submission of its proposal or bid as applicable.

In order to receive the Local Preference points of five (5) points the Proposer must meet one (1) of the following criteria, provide supporting documentation as

required and certify under oath that it is eligible to receive the local preference points by signing and submitting Form H, Local Preference Affidavit located in Section 5 of this RFP.

The Proposer must indicate which one (1) of the following criteria they will utilize in order to receive local preference:

1. Business having a business location within the geographic boundaries of Fulton County.

The following supporting documentation must be provided:

- Copy of occupational tax certificate (business license) form Fulton County or a city located within Fulton County, or;
- Copy of a lease or rental agreement, or;
- Proof of ownership interest in a location within the geographical boundaries of Fulton County.

1. Businesses where at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the owners of the business are residents of Fulton County but the business is located outside of Fulton County.

The following supporting documentation must be provided:

2. Businesses where at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the employees of the business are residents of Fulton County but the business is located outside of Fulton County.

The following supporting documentation must be provided:

- Provide a list of all employees name and address.

Failure to provide the required supporting documentation with your proposal submittal shall result in your firm receiving a "0" (zero) for Local Preference. In the event the affidavit or other declaration under oath is determined to be false, such business shall be deemed "non-responsive" and shall not be considered for award of the applicable contract.

Section 6 – Service Disabled Veterans Preference

Service Disabled Veterans Business Enterprise Preference is given to businesses that are independent and continuing operations for profit, performing commercially useful functions, and which is 51 percent owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are disabled as a result of military service who have been honorably discharged, designated as such by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

In order to receive the SDVBE Preference points the Proposer must complete and submit Form I, Service Disabled Veterans Preference Affidavit located in Section 5 of this RFP certifying under oath that it is eligible to receive the SDVBE preference points. The Service Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (“SDVBE”) must be certified as such by the County’s Office of Contract Compliance.

Section 7 – Cost

The respondent with the lowest total cost will receive the full 10 points. For respondents with the second, third, fourth, etc., their total costs will be divided into the lowest cost and multiplied by 10, the total points allowed for cost.

Each successive cost \times Points allocated for cost in RFP = Cost proposal score

Section 8 – Past Performance

The County will determine responsibility based on the following criteria for the proposer(s) recommended by the Evaluation Committee.

Identify three (3) projects where the Proposer has performed projects similar in size and scope with entities comparable to Fulton County within the past three (3) years. Limit your response to one (1) page per project; please provide the following information for each project:

- The name of the project, the owner, year performed and the project location.
- A description of the project.
- A reference, including a contact name, addresses and phone number and e-mail address. This reference should be the owner’s staff member who was in charge of the project for the owner and should be from service line repair/protection clients with programs similar to the one described in this proposal with at least one (1) reference of a similar size and age of service lines as the County.

Section 9 – Proposer Financial Information

It is the policy of the County to conduct a review of a firm’s financial responsibility in order to determine the firm’s capability to successfully perform the work.

If submitting as a Joint Venture, Partnership, Limited Liability Corporation or Limited Liability Partnership, the financials must be submitted for each entity that comprises the prime contractor.

The following documentation is required in order for the County to evaluate financial responsibility:

- a. Provide your firm's most recent balance sheets.
- b. Provide your firm's most recent Dun & Bradstreet, Value Line Reports or other credit ratings/report.
- c. Identify any evidence of access to a line or letter of credit. The evidence must be provided by a financial institution.
- d. Provide a sworn statement that your firm has not filed petition(s) for federal bankruptcy or state insolvency. The statement must be notarized.

Section 10 – Disclosure Form and Questionnaire

It is the policy of Fulton County to review the history of litigation of each Proposer that includes bankruptcy history, insolvency history, civil and criminal proceedings, judgments and termination for cause in order to determine whether a firm's business practices, legal practices and overall reputation in the industry is one that would be acceptable to perform work for Fulton County. The Disclosure Form and Questionnaire is provided in Section 5, Proposal Forms, Form D.

3.7 COST PROPOSAL FORMAT AND CONTENT

The Cost Proposal shall be provided in a **separate sealed envelope**. The Cost Proposal shall include current information and shall be arranged and include content as described below:

The Proposer shall include an introduction which outlines the contents of the Cost Proposal.

Section 2 - Completed Cost Proposal Forms

The Proposer is required to complete **all** of the Cost Proposal Forms provided.

The Water Service Line Coverage price line items the and the Sewer Service Line Coverage price lines (1, 3, 5 & 7) shall include the County Administration Fee; however, the county administration fee included under those line items should be priced separately under line items 2, 4, 6 & 8 for information purposes only, and not for evaluating as additional costs.

After reasonable notice to the entity involved and reasonable opportunity for that entity to be heard, the Purchasing Agent, after consultation with user department, the County Manager and the County Attorney shall have the authority to suspend an entity for cause from consideration for award of county contracts. As used in this section, the term entity means any business entity, individual, firm, contractor, subcontractor or business corporation, partnership, limited liability corporation, firm, contractor, subcontractor or business structured; provided, further, that any such entity shall also be subject to suspension under this section if any of its constituents, members, subcontractors at any tier of such entity's and the entity, or any constituent or member, knew or should have known of the commission of the act. The suspension shall be for a period not to exceed three (3) years unless cause is based on a felony conviction for an offense related or associated with fraudulent contracting or misappropriation of funds wherein the suspension shall not exceed seven (7) years.

(b) *Causes for Suspension. The causes for suspension include:*

- 1) Conviction for commission of a criminal offense as an incident to obtain or attempting to obtain a public or private contract or subcontract, or in performance of such contract or subcontract;

- 2) Conviction of state or federal statutes of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, receiving stolen property or other offense indicating a lack of business integrity or business honesty which currently, seriously and directly affects responsibility as a county contractor.
- 3) Conviction of state or federal anti-trust statutes arising out of the solicitation and submission of bids and proposals;
- 4) Violation of contract provisions, as set forth below, of a character which is regarded by the Purchasing Agent to be so serious as to justify suspension action:
 - a. Failure to perform in accordance with the specifications within a time limit provided in a county contract;
 - b. A recent record of failure to perform or unsatisfactory performance in accordance with the terms of one or more contracts; provided, that failure to perform or unsatisfactory performance caused by acts beyond the control of the contractor shall not be considered to be a basis for suspension;
 - c. Material representation of the composition of the ownership or workforce or business entity certified to the county as a minority business enterprise; or
 - d. Falsification of any documents.
- i. For violation of the ethical standards set forth in Fulton County Code Chapter 9, Code of Ethics.
- ii. Knowing misrepresentation to the county, of the use which a majority owned contractor intends to make a minority business enterprise (a business entity at least 51 percent of which is owned and controlled by minority persons, as defined in Fulton County Code Chapter 6, Article B, Minority Business Enterprise Affirmative Action Program and certified as such by the County) as a subcontractor or a joint venture partner, in performing work under contract with the County.

Failure to fully and truthfully provide the information required, may result in the disqualification of your bid/proposal from consideration or termination of the Contract, once awarded. This document must be completed and included as a part of the bid/proposal package along with other required documents.

SECTION 6 CONTRACT COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

6.1 NON-DISCRIMINATION IN PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING

It is the policy of Fulton County Government that discrimination against businesses by reason of the race, color, gender or national origin of the ownership of any such business is prohibited. Furthermore, it is the policy of the Board of Commissioners ("Board") that Fulton County and all vendors and contractors doing business with Fulton County shall provide to all businesses the opportunity to participate in contracting and procurement paid, in whole or in part, with monetary appropriations of the Board without regard to the race, color, gender or national origin of the ownership of any such business. Similarly, it is the policy of the Board that the contracting and procurement practices of Fulton County should not implicate Fulton County as either an active or passive participant in the discriminatory practices engaged in by private contractors or vendors seeking to obtain contracts with Fulton County.

Implementation of Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Policy

The County effectuates Equal Employment Opportunity thru Policy #800-8, Non-Discrimination in Contracting and Procurement. This policy considers racial and gender workforce availability. The availability of each workgroup is derived from the work force demographics set forth in the 2000 Census EEO file prepared by the United States Department of Commerce for the applicable labor pool normally utilized for the contract.

Monitoring of EEO Policy

Upon award of a contract with Fulton County, the successful bidder/proposer must complete an Equal Employment Opportunity Report (EEOR), describing the racial and gender make-up of the firm's work force. If the EEOR indicates that the firm's demographic composition indicates underutilization of employee's of a particular ethnic group for each job category, the firm will be required to submit an aggressive action plan setting forth steps the firm will take to address the identified underutilization.

6.2 EQUAL BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY PLAN (EBO PLAN)

During the course of the project, the Prime Contractor shall demonstrate that they have made all efforts reasonably possible to ensure that Minority and Female Business Enterprises (MFBE) have had a full and fair opportunity to compete and win subcontracts on this project. The Prime Contractor is required to include all outreach attempts that would demonstrate a "Good Faith Effort" in the solicitation of sub-consultants/subcontractors.

Written documentation demonstrating the Prime Contractor's outreach efforts to identify, contact, contract with or utilize Minority or Female owned businesses shall include holding pre-bid conferences, publishing advertisements in general circulation media, trade association publications, minority-focused media, and the County's bid board, as well as other efforts.

Upon a determination by the Purchasing Agent and the Director of Human Services that a contractor has failed to comply with any portion of this policy, the County may impose the following:

1. Ten percent (10%) of all future payments under the involved eligible project shall be entitled to be withheld from a contractor that has violated this policy until the contractor complies with the provisions of this policy.

**Insurance and Risk Management Provisions

It is Fulton County Government's practice to obtain Certificates of Insurance from our Contractors and Vendors. Insurance must be written by a licensed agent in a company licensed to write insurance in the State of Georgia. Respondents shall submit with the bid/proposal evidence of insurability satisfactory to Fulton County Government as to form and content. Either of the following forms of evidence is acceptable:

- A letter from an insurance carrier stating that upon your firm/company being the successful Bidder/Respondent that a Certificate of Insurance shall be issued in compliance with the Insurance and Risk Management Provisions outlined below.
- A Certificate of Insurance complying with the Insurance and Risk Management Provisions outlined below (Request for Bid/Proposal number and Project Description must appear on the Certificate of Insurance).
- A combination of specific policies written with an umbrella policy covering liabilities in excess of the required limits is acceptable to achieve the applicable insurance coverage levels.

Upon award, the Contractor/Vendor must maintain at their expense, insurance with policy limits equal to or greater than the limits described below. Any and all Insurance Coverage(s) and Bonds required under the terms and conditions of the contract shall be maintained during the entire length of the contract, including any extensions or renewals thereto, and until all work has been completed to the satisfaction of Fulton County Government.

Certificates shall state that the policy or policies shall not expire, be cancelled or altered without at least thirty (30) days prior written notice to Fulton County Government. Policies and Certificates of Insurance are to list Fulton County Government, Its Employees, Servants and Agents as an Additional Insured (except for Workers' Compensation and Professional Liability) and shall conform to all terms and conditions (including coverage of the indemnification and hold harmless agreement) contained in the Insurance and Risk Management Provisions.

The Contractor agrees to name the Owner and all other parties required of the Contractor/Vendor shall be included as additional insureds on the CGL, using ISO Additional Insured Endorsement forms CG 2010 11/85, its equivalent or on a blanket basis. This insurance shall apply as Primary Insurance before any other insurance or self-insurance, including any deductible, non-contributory, and Waiver of Subrogation in favor of Fulton County.

Additional Insured under the General Liability, Auto Liability, Umbrella Policies (with exception of Workers Compensation), with no Cross Suits exclusion.

If Fulton County Government shall so request, the Respondent, Contractor or Vendor will furnish the County for its inspection and approval such policies of insurance with all endorsements, or confirmed specimens thereof certified by the insurance company to be true and correct copies.

USE OF PREMISES

Contractor/Vendor shall confine its apparatus, the storage of materials and the operations of its workers to limits/requirements indicated by law, ordinance, permits and any restrictions of Fulton County Government and shall not unreasonably encumber the premises with its materials.

PROTECTION OF PROPERTY

Contractor/Vendor will adequately protect its own work from damage, will protect Fulton County Government's property from damage or loss and will take all necessary precautions during the progress of the work to protect all persons and the property of others from damage or loss.

Contractor/Vendor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of employees of the work and shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Federal, State and local safety laws and building codes to prevent accidents or injury to persons on, about, or adjacent to the premises where work is being performed.

Contractor/Vendor shall erect and properly maintain at all times as required by the conditions and progress of the work, all necessary safeguards for the protection of its employees, Fulton County Government employees and the public and shall post all applicable signage and other warning devices to protect against potential hazards for the work being performed.

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

Consultant/Contractor shall indemnify, release, and hold harmless Fulton County, its Commissioners and their respective officers, members, employees, and agents, from and against all liability, damages, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and expenses incurred by any of them), claims, suits and judgments only to the extent such liability arises or results from the negligence of the Consultant/Contractor in the delivery of the Work under this Agreement, but such indemnity is limited to those liabilities arising from a Negligent Professional Act, as defined below. This indemnification survives the termination of this Agreement and shall also survive the dissolution or to the extent allowed by law, the bankruptcy of Consultant/Contractor.

For the purposes of the Professional Services Indemnity above, a "Negligent Professional Act" means a negligent act, error, or omission in the performance of Professional Services (or by any person or entity, including joint ventures, for whom Consultant/Contractor is liable) that causes liability and fails to meet the applicable professional standard of care, skill and ability under similar conditions and like surrounding circumstances, as is ordinarily employed by others in their profession.

WITNESSETH

ARTICLE 1. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

County hereby engages Contractor, and Contractor hereby agrees, to perform the services hereinafter set forth in accordance with this Agreement, consisting of the following contract documents:

- I. Form of Agreement;
- II. Addenda;
- III. Exhibit A: General Conditions;
- IV. Exhibit B: Special Conditions [where applicable]
- V. Exhibit C: Scope of Work
- VI. Exhibit D: Compensation;
- VII. Exhibit E: Purchasing Forms;

- VIII. Exhibit F: Contract Compliance Forms;
- IX. Exhibit G: Insurance and Risk Management Form;
- X. Exhibit H: Payment & Performance Bonds (if applicable)
- XI. Appendix 1: Policy 800-6, Procedures for Handling Change Orders

The foregoing documents constitute the entire Agreement of the parties pertaining to the Project hereof and is intended as a complete and exclusive statement of promises, representations, discussions and agreements oral or otherwise that have been made in connection therewith. No modifications or amendment to this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties unless the same is in writing, conforms to Fulton County Policy and Procedure 800-6 governing change orders, is signed by the County's and the Contractor's duly authorized representatives, and entered upon the meeting minutes of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners.

If any portion of the Contract Documents shall be in conflict with any other portion, the various documents comprising the Contract Documents shall govern in the following order of precedence: 1) the Agreement, 2) the Bid document, 3) any Addenda, 4) change orders, 5) the exhibits, and 6) portions of Contractor's proposal that was accepted by the County and made a part of the Contract Documents.

The Agreement was approved by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners on **[Insert Board of Commissioners approval date and item number]**.

ARTICLE 2. **SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable for any reason, the unenforceability thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect, and enforceable in accordance with its terms.

ARTICLE 3. **DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT**

County and Contractor agree the Project is to perform **[Insert project description]**. All exhibits referenced in this agreement are incorporated by reference and constitute an integral part of this Agreement as if they were contained herein.

ARTICLE 4. **SCOPE OF WORK**

Unless modified in writing by both parties in the manner specified in the agreement, duties of Contractor shall not be construed to exceed those services specifically set forth herein. Contractor agrees to provide all services, products, and data and to perform all tasks described in Exhibit C, Scope of Work.

ARTICLE 5. **SERVICES PROVIDED BY COUNTY**

Contractor shall gather from County all available non-privileged data and information pertinent to the performance of the services for the Project. Certain services as described in Exhibit C, Scope of Work, if required, will be performed and furnished by County in a timely manner so as not to unduly delay Contractor in the performance of

said obligations. County shall have the final decision as to what data and information is pertinent.

County will appoint in writing a County authorized representative with respect to work to be performed under this Agreement until County gives written notice of the appointment of a successor. The County's authorized representative shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and define County's policies, consistent with County rules and regulations. Contractor may rely upon written consents and approvals signed by County's authorized representative that are consistent with County rules and regulations.

ARTICLE 6. MODIFICATIONS

If during the course of performing the Project, County and Contractor agree that it is necessary to make changes in the Project as described herein and referenced exhibits, such changes will be incorporated by written amendments in the form of Change Orders to this Agreement. Any such Change Order and/or supplemental agreement shall not become effective or binding unless approved by the Board of Commissioners and entered on the minutes. Such modifications shall conform to the requirements of Fulton County Policy 800-6, specified in Appendix 1.

ARTICLE 7. SCHEDULE OF WORK

Contractor shall not proceed to furnish such services and County shall not become obligated to pay for same until a written authorization to proceed (Notice to Proceed) has been sent to Contractor from County. The Contractor shall begin work under this Agreement no later than five (5) days after the effective date of notice to proceed.

ARTICLE 8. CONTRACT TERM

ARTICLE 9. COMPENSATION

Compensation for work performed by Contractor on Project shall be in accordance with the payment provisions and compensation schedule, attached as Exhibit C, Compensation.

ARTICLE 10. PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT

Contractor shall designate in writing a person(s) to serve as its authorized representative(s) who shall have sole authority to represent Contractor on all manners

pertaining to this contract.

Contractor represents that it has secured or will secure, at its' own expense, all equipment and personnel necessary to complete this Agreement, none of whom shall be employees of or have any contractual relationship with County. All of the services required hereunder will be performed by Contractor under his supervision and all personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under law to perform such services.

Written notification shall be immediately provided to County upon change or severance of any of the authorized representative(s), listed key personnel or subcontractor performing services on this Project by Contractor. No changes or substitutions shall be permitted in Contractor's key personnel or subcontractor as set forth herein without the prior written approval of the County. Requests for changes in key personnel or subcontractors will not be unreasonably withheld by County.

ARTICLE 11. SUSPENSION OF WORK

Suspension Notice: The County may by written notice to the Contractor, suspend at any time the performance of all or any portion of the services to be performed under this Agreement. Upon receipt of a suspension notice, the Contractor must, unless the notice requires otherwise:

- 1) Immediately discontinue suspended services on the date and to the extent specified in the notice;
- 2) Place no further orders or subcontracts for material, services or facilities with respect to suspended services, other than to the extent required in the notice; and
- 3) Take any other reasonable steps to minimize costs associated with the suspension.

Notice to Resume: Upon receipt of notice to resume suspended services, the Contractor will immediately resume performance under this Agreement as required in the notice.

ARTICLE 12. DISPUTES

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this contract which is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by the **[Insert user department name]** designated representative. The representative shall reduce the decision to writing and mail or otherwise furnish a copy thereof to the Contractor. The Contractor shall have 30 days from date the decision is sent to appeal the decision to the County Manager or his designee by mailing or otherwise furnishing to the County Manager or designee, copy of the written appeal. The decision of the County Manager or his designee for the determination of such appeal shall be final and conclusive. This condition shall not be pleaded in any suit involving a question of fact arising under this Agreement, unless the same is fraudulent, or capricious, or arbitrary, or so grossly erroneous as necessarily to imply bad faith, or is not supported by substantial evidence. In connection with any appeal proceeding under this clause,

Contractor shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of an appeal. Pending any final decision of a dispute hereunder, Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of the Agreement and in accordance with the decision of the **[Insert user department]** designated representative.

ARTICLE 13. **TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT FOR CAUSE**

- (1) Either County or Contractor may terminate work under this Agreement in the event the other party fails to perform in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement. Any party seeking to terminate this Agreement is required to give thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party.
- (2) Notice of termination shall be delivered by certified mail with receipt for delivery returned to the sender.
- (3) **TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE** and if the Contractor refuses or fails to perform the work as specified in Exhibit C, Scope of Work and maintain the scheduled level of effort as proposed, or any separable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure completion of the work within the specified time period, or any extension or tolling there of, or fails to complete said work within such time. The County may exercise any remedy available under law or this Agreement. Failure to maintain the scheduled level of effort as proposed or deviation from the aforesaid proposal without prior approval of County shall constitute cause for termination
- (4) The County may, by written notice to Contractor, terminate Contractor's right to proceed with the Project or such part of the Project as to which there has been delay. In such event, the County may take over the work and perform the same to completion, by contract or otherwise, and Contractor shall be required to provide all copies of finished or unfinished documents prepared by Contractor under this Agreement.
- (5) Contractor shall be entitled to receive compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such documents as reasonably determined by the County.
- (6) Whether or not the Contractor's right to proceed with the work has been terminated, the Contractor shall be liable for any damage to the County resulting from the Contractor's refusal or failure to complete the work within the specified time period, and said damages shall include, but not be limited to, any additional costs associated with the County obtaining the services of another Contractor to complete the project.

ARTICLE 14. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE OF COUNTY

Notwithstanding any other provisions, the County may terminate this Agreement for its convenience at any time by a written notice to Contractor. If the Agreement is terminated for convenience by the County, as provided in this article, Contractor will be paid compensation for those services actually performed. Partially completed tasks will be compensated for based on a signed statement of completion to be submitted by Contractor which shall itemize each task element and briefly state what work has been completed and what work remains to be done.

If, after termination, it is determined that the Contractor was not in default, or that the default was excusable, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the termination had been issued for the convenience of the government.

ARTICLE 15. WAIVER OF BREACH

The waiver by either party of a breach or violation of any provision of this Agreement, shall not operate or be construed to be, a waiver of any subsequent breach or violation of the same or other provision thereof.

ARTICLE 16. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor shall perform the services under this Agreement as an independent contractor and nothing contained herein shall be construed to be inconsistent with such relationship or status. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted or construed to constitute Contractor or any of its agents or employees to be the agent, employee or representative of County.

ARTICLE 17. RESPONSIBILITY OF CONTRACTOR

Contractor represents that it has, or will secure at its own expenses, all personnel appropriate to perform all work to be completed under this Agreement;

All the services required hereunder will be performed by Contractor or under the direct supervision of Contractor. All personnel engaged in the Project by Contractor shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under applicable State and local law to perform such services.

None of the work or services covered by this Agreement shall be transferred, assigned, or subcontracted by Contractor without the prior written consent of the County.

ARTICLE 18. INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor hereby agrees to release, indemnify, defend and hold harmless Fulton County, its Commissioners, officers, employees, subcontractors, successors, assigns and agents, from and against any and all losses (including death), claims, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including but not limited to all actions, proceedings, or investigations in respect thereof and any costs of judgments, settlements, court costs, attorney's fees or expenses, regardless of the outcome of any such action, proceeding,

or investigation), caused by, relating to, based upon or arising out of any act or omission by Contractor, its directors, officers, employees, subcontractors, successors, assigns or agents, or otherwise in connection (directly or indirectly) with its acceptance, or the performance, or nonperformance, of its obligations under these agreements. Such obligations shall not be construed to negate, abridge or otherwise reduce any other rights or obligations of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person as set forth in this paragraph.

Contractor obligation to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless, as set forth hereinabove, shall also include, but is not limited to, any matter arising out of any actual or alleged infringement of any patent, trademark, copyright, or service mark, or other actual or alleged unfair competition disparagement of product or service, or other tort or any type whatsoever, or any actual or alleged violation of trade regulations.

Contractor further agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Fulton County, its Commissioners, officers, employees, subcontractors, successors, assigns and agents from and against any and all claims or liability for compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act, Disability Benefits Act, or any other employee benefits act arising out of injuries sustained by any employees of Contractor. These indemnities shall not be limited by reason of the listing of any insurance coverage.

These indemnity provisions are for the protection of the County indemnities only and shall not establish, of themselves, any liability to third parties. The provisions of this article shall survive termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 19. COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

Contractor warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this Agreement upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees maintained by Contractor for the purpose of securing business and that Contractor has not received any non-County fee related to this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. For breach or violation of this warranty, County shall have the right to annul this Agreement without liability or at its discretion to deduct from the Contract Price or consideration the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee.

ARTICLE 20. INSURANCE

Contractor agrees to obtain and maintain during the entire term of this Agreement, all of the insurance required as specified in the Agreement documents, Exhibit G, Insurance and Risk Management Forms, with the County as an additional insured and shall furnish the County a Certificate of Insurance showing the required coverage. The cancellation of any policy of insurance required by this Agreement shall meet the requirements of notice under the laws of the State of Georgia as presently set forth in the Georgia Code.

ARTICLE 21. PROHIBITED INTEREST

Section 21.01 Conflict of interest:

Contractor agrees that it presently has no interest and shall acquire no interest direct or indirect that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder. Contractor further agrees that, in the performance of the Agreement, no person having any such interest shall be employed.

Section 21.02 Interest of Public Officials:

No member, officer or employee of County during his tenure shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.

ARTICLE 22. SUBCONTRACTING

Contractor shall not subcontract any part of the work covered by this Agreement or permit subcontracted work to be further subcontracted without prior written approval of County.

ARTICLE 23. ASSIGNABILITY

Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement or any portion thereof without the prior expressed written consent of County. Any attempted assignment or subcontracting by Contractor without the prior expressed written consent of County shall at County's sole option terminate this Agreement without any notice to Contractor of such termination. Contractor binds itself, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives of such other party in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained herein.

ARTICLE 24. ANTI-KICKBACK CLAUSE

Salaries of engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, clerical and technicians performing work under this Agreement shall be paid unconditionally and not less often than once a month without deduction or rebate on any account except only such payroll deductions as are mandatory by law. Contractor hereby promises to comply with all applicable "Anti-Kickback" Laws, and shall insert appropriate provisions in all subcontracts covering work under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 25. AUDITS AND INSPECTORS

At any time during normal business hours and as often as County may deem necessary, Contractor shall make available to County and/or representatives of the County for examination all of its records with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement.

It shall also permit County and/or representative of the County to audit, examine and make copies, excerpts or transcripts from such records of personnel, conditions of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement.

Contractor's records of personnel, conditions of employment, and financial statements (hereinafter "Information") constitute trade secrets and are considered confidential and proprietary by Contractor. To the extent County audits or examines such Information related to this Agreement, County shall not disclose or otherwise make available to third parties any such Information without Contractor's prior written consent unless required to do so by a court order. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as granting County any right to make copies, excerpts or transcripts of such information outside the area covered by this Agreement without the prior written consent of Contractor. Contractor shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred on the Project and used in support of its proposal and shall make such material available at all reasonable times during the period of the Agreement and for eight years from the date of final payment under the Agreement, for inspection by County or any reviewing agencies and copies thereof shall be furnished upon request and at no additional cost to County. Contractor agrees that the provisions of this Article shall be included in any Agreements it may make with any subcontractor, assignee or transferee.

ARTICLE 26. ACCOUNTING SYSTEM

Contractor shall have an accounting system, which is established, and maintaining in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Contractor must account for cost in a manner consistent with generally accepted accounting procedures, as approved by Fulton County.

ARTICLE 27. VERBAL AGREEMENT

No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent or employee of County either before, during or after the execution of this Agreement, shall affect or modify any of the terms of obligations herein contained, nor shall such verbal agreement or conversation entitle Contractor to any additional payment whatsoever under the terms of this Agreement. All changes to this shall be in writing and the form of a change order in supplemental agreement, approved by the County, and entered on the Minutes of the Board of Commissioners.

ARTICLE 28. NOTICES

All notices shall be in writing and delivered in person or transmitted by certified mail, postage prepaid.

ARTICLE 29. **JURISDICTION**

This Agreement will be executed and implemented in Fulton County. Further, this Agreement shall be administered and interpreted under the laws of the State of Georgia. Jurisdiction of litigation arising from this Agreement shall be in the Fulton County Superior Courts. If any part of this Agreement is found to be in conflict with applicable laws, such part shall be inoperative, null and void insofar as it is in conflict with said laws, but the remainder of this Agreement shall be in full force and effect.

Whenever reference is made in the Agreement to standards or codes in accordance with which work is to be performed, the edition or revision of the standards or codes current on the effective date of this Agreement shall apply, unless otherwise expressly stated.

ARTICLE 30. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY**

During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor agrees as follows:

Section 30.01 Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex or national origin;

Section 30.02 Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by, or on behalf of, Contractor state that all qualified applicants, will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, sex or national origin;

Section 30.03 Contractor will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by the Agreement so that such provision will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

ARTICLE 31. **FORCE MAJEURE**

Neither County nor Contractor shall be deemed in violation of this Agreement if either is

prevented from performing its obligations hereunder for any reason beyond its control, including but not limited to acts of God, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods or catastrophic failures of public transportation, provided however, that nothing herein shall relieve or be construed to relieve Contractor from performing its obligations hereunder in the event of riots, rebellions or legal strikes.

ARTICLE 32. OPEN RECORDS ACT

The Georgia Open Records Act, O.C.G.A. Section 50-18-70 et seq., applies to this Agreement. The Contractor acknowledges that any documents or computerized data provided to the County by the Contractor may be subject to release to the public. The Contractor also acknowledges that documents and computerized data created or held by the Contractor in relation to the Agreement may be subject to release to the public, to include documents turned over to the County. The Contractor shall cooperate with and provide assistance to the County in rapidly responding to Open Records Act requests. The Contractor shall notify the County of any Open Records Act requests no later than 24 hours following receipt of any such requests by the Contractor. The Contractor shall promptly comply with the instructions or requests of the County in relation to responding to Open Records Act requests.

ARTICLE 33. CONTRACTOR'S COMPLIANCE WITH ALL ASSURANCES OR PROMISES MADE IN RESPONSE TO PROCUREMENT

Where the procurement documents do not place a degree or level of service relating to the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or any other matter relating to the services being procured, should any Contractor submit a response to the County promising to provide a certain level of service for the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or any other matter, including where such promises or assurances are greater than what is required by the procurement documents, and should this response containing these promises or assurances be accepted by the County and made a part of the Contract Documents, then the degree or level of service promised relating to the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or other matter shall be considered to be a material part of the Agreement between the Contractor and the County, such that the Contractor's failure to provide the agreed upon degree or level of service or participation shall be a material breach of the Agreement giving the County just cause to terminate the Agreement for cause, pursuant to ARTICLE 14 of the Agreement.

ARTICLE 34. INVOICING AND PAYMENT

Contractor shall submit monthly invoices for work performed during the previous calendar month, in a form acceptable to the County and accompanied by all support documentation requested by the County, for payment and for services that were completed during the preceding phase. The County shall review for approval of said invoices. The County shall have the right not to pay any invoice or part thereof if not properly supported, or if the costs requested or a part thereof, as determined by the County, are reasonably in excess of the actual stage of completion.

Time of Payment: Invoices for payment shall be submitted to County by the first (1st)

calendar day of the month to facilitate processing for payment in that same month. Invoices received after the first (1st) calendar day of the month may not be paid until the last day of the following month. The County shall make payments to Contractor by U.S. mail approximately thirty (30) days after receipt of a proper invoice. Parties hereto expressly agree that the above contract term shall supersede the rates of interest, payment periods, and contract and subcontract terms provided for under the Georgia Prompt Pay Act, O.C.G.A. 13-11-1 et seq., pursuant to 13-11-7(b), and the rates of interest, payment periods, and contract and subcontract terms provided for under the Prompt Pay Act shall have no application to this Agreement; parties further agree that the County shall not be liable for any interest or penalty arising from late payments.

Contractor's cumulative invoices shall not exceed the total not-to-exceed fee established for this Agreement.

County's Right to Withhold Payments: The County may withhold payments for services that involve disputed costs, involve disputed audits, or are otherwise performed in an inadequate fashion. Payments withheld by the County will be released and paid to the Contractor when the services are subsequently performed adequately and on a timely basis, the causes for disputes are reconciled or any other remedies or actions stipulated by the County are satisfied. The County shall promptly pay any undisputed items contained in such invoices.

Payment of Sub-contractors/Suppliers: The Contractor must certify in writing that all sub-contractors of the Contractor and suppliers have been promptly paid for work and materials and previous progress payments received. In the event the prime Contractor is unable to pay sub-contractors or suppliers until it has received a progress payment from Fulton County, the prime Contractor shall pay all sub-contractors or supplier funds due from said progress payments within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of payment from Fulton County and in no event later than fifteen days as provided for by State Law.

Acceptance of Payments by Contractor; Release. The acceptance by the Contractor of any payment for services under this Agreement will, in each instance, operate as, and be a release to the County from, all claim and liability to the Contractor for work performed or furnished for or relating to the service for which payment was accepted, unless the Contractor within five (5) days of its receipt of a payment, advises the County in writing of a specific claim it contends is not released by that payment.

ARTICLE 35. TAXES

The Contractor shall pay all sales, retail, occupational, service, excise, old age benefit and unemployment compensation taxes, consumer, use and other similar taxes, as well as any other taxes or duties on the materials, equipment, and labor for the work provided by the Contractor which are legally enacted by any municipal, county, state or federal authority, department or agency at the time bids are received, whether or not yet effective. The Contractor shall maintain records pertaining to such taxes as well as payment thereof and shall make the same available to the County at all reasonable times for inspection and copying. The Contractor shall apply for any and all tax exemptions which may be applicable and shall timely request from the County such documents and information as may be necessary to obtain such tax exemptions. The County shall have no liability to the Contractor for payment of any tax from which it is exempt.

ARTICLE 36. PERMITS, LICENSES AND BONDS

All permits and licenses necessary for the work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor. If any permit, license or certificate expires or is revoked, terminated, or suspended as a result of any action on the part of the Contractor, the Contractor shall not be entitled to additional compensation or time.

ARTICLE 37. NON-APPROPRIATION

This Agreement states the total obligation of the County to the Contractor for the calendar year of execution. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, the obligation of the County to make payments provided under this Agreement shall be subject to annual appropriations of funds thereof by the governing body of the County and such obligation shall not constitute a pledge of the full faith and credit of the County within the meaning of any constitutional debt limitation. The Director of Finance shall deliver written notice to the Contractor in the event the County does not intend to budget funds for the succeeding Contract year.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, if sufficient funds have not been appropriated to support continuation of this Agreement for an additional calendar year or an additional term of the Agreement, this Agreement shall terminate absolutely and without further obligation on the part of the County at the close of the calendar year of its execution and at the close of each succeeding calendar year of which it may be renewed, unless a shorter termination period is provided or the County suspends performance pending the appropriation of funds.

ARTICLE 38. WAGE CLAUSE

Contractor shall agree that in the performance of this Agreement the Contractor will comply with all lawful agreements, if any, which the Contractor had made with any association, union, or other entity, with respect to wages, salaries, and working conditions, so as not to cause inconvenience, picketing, or work stoppage.

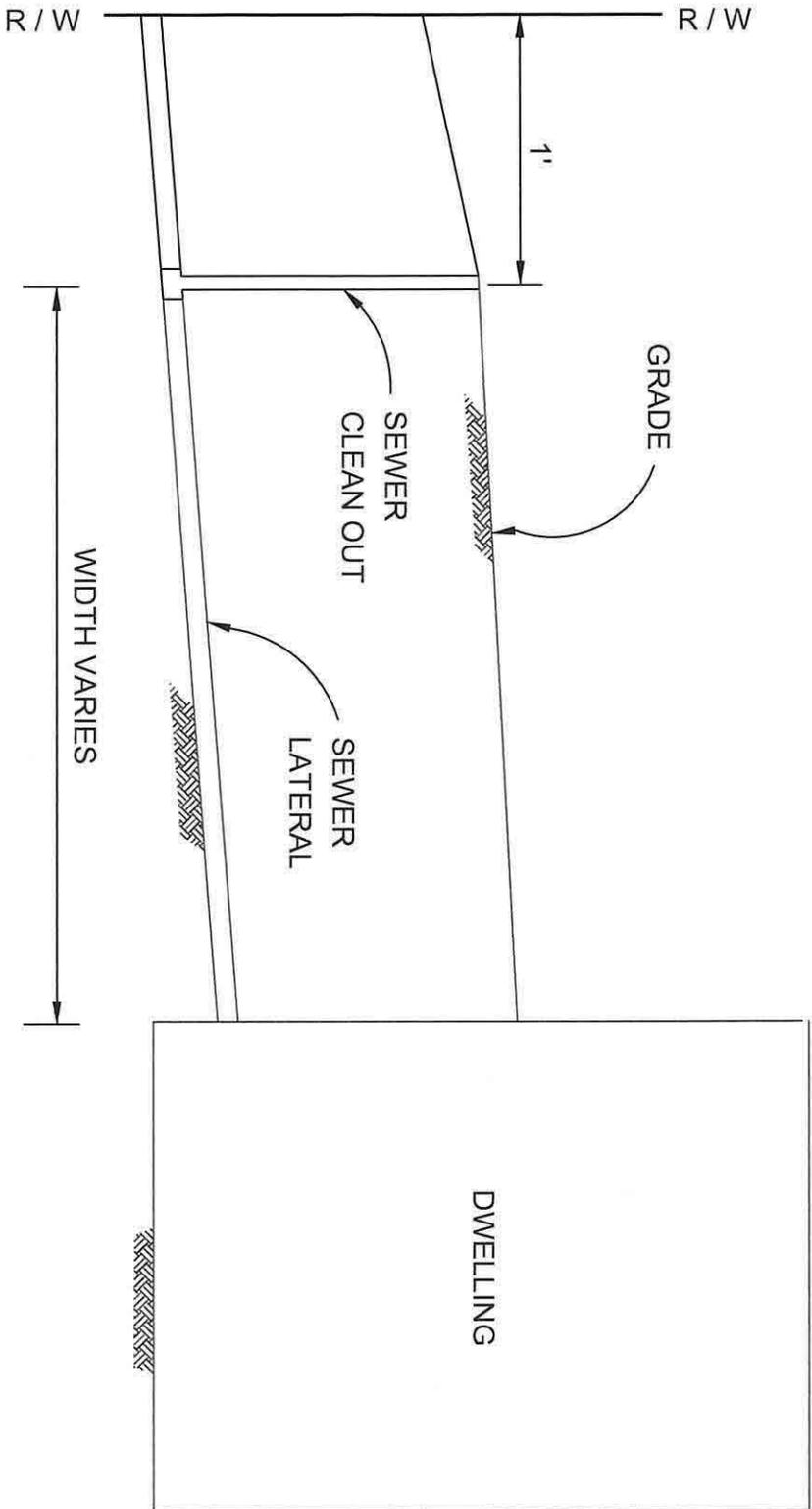

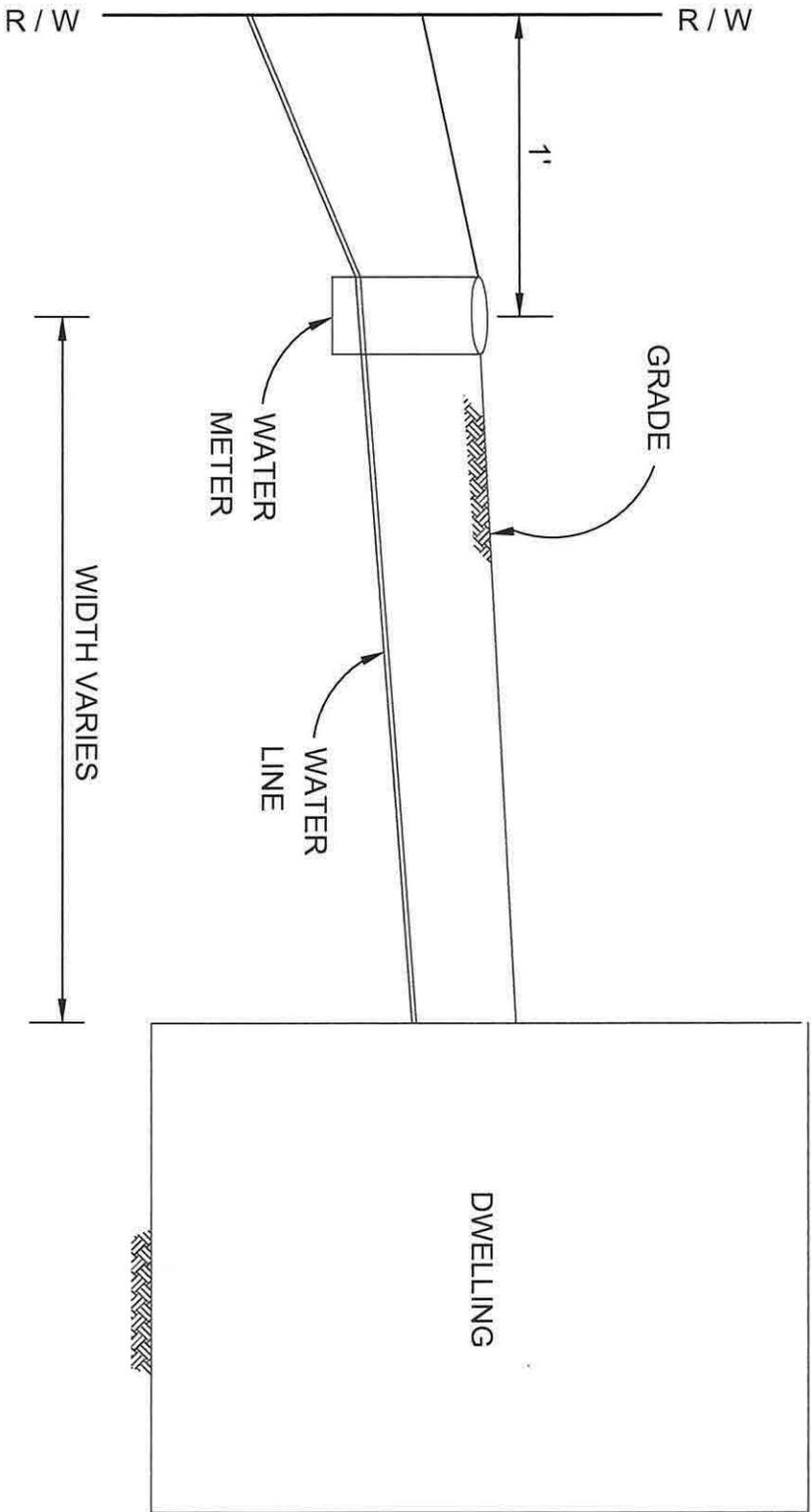

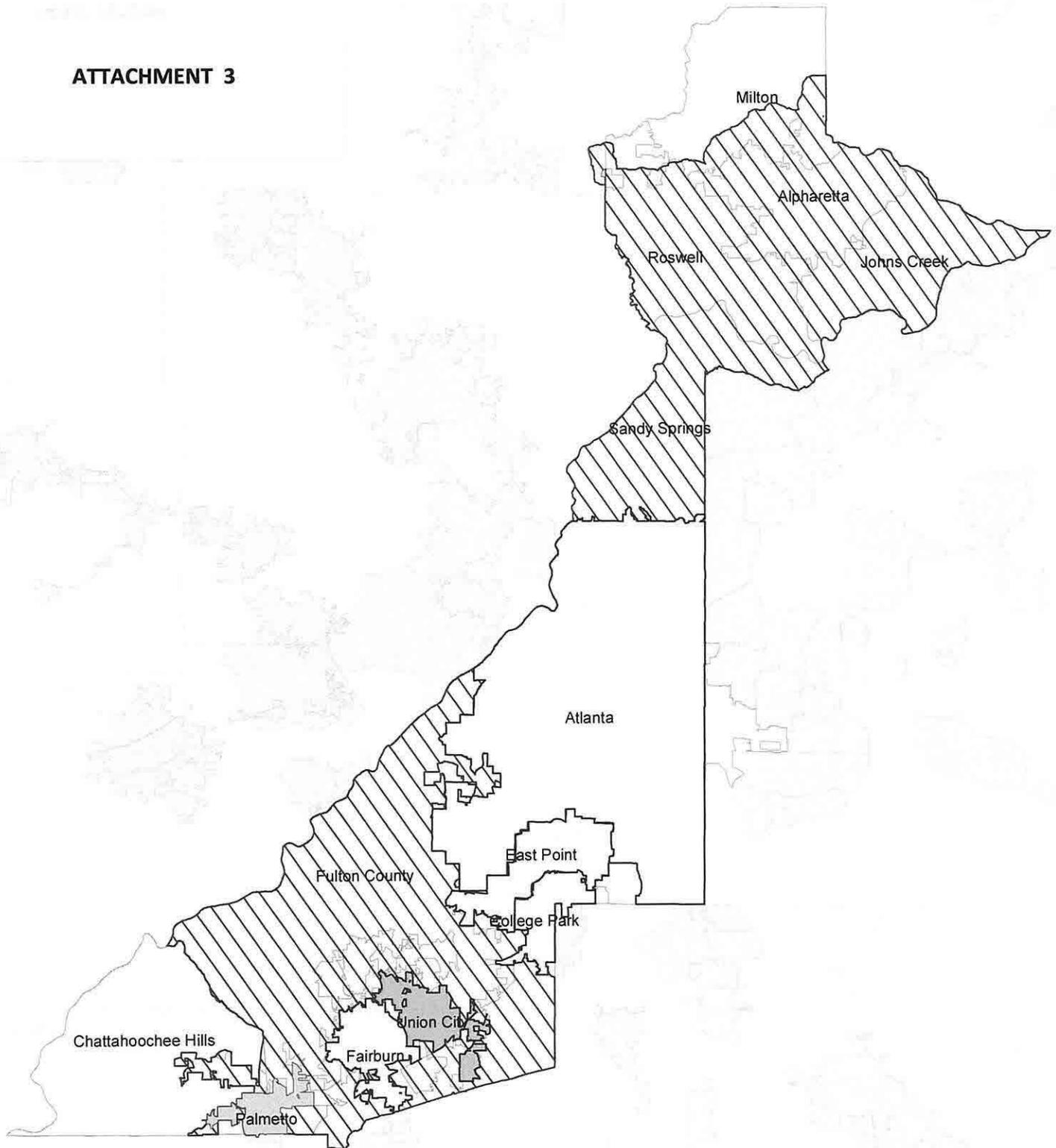
