1 DETECTIVE THORPE: Once again, for the record, my name
2 is Detective J. Thorpe, Jr., City of Atlanta Police
3 Department Homicide Unit. Today's date is February 3,
4 2012. Time is approximately 2100, 2111 hours. Um, sitting
5 here with me is also my partner, Detective S. Bowers [ph],
6 Atlanta Police Homicide Unit, also, and I'm here to
7 interview Mr. Michael Perkins.

8 Um, Mr. Perkins, this is in reference to the homicide
9 investigation of Miss Constance Cox, Atlanta Police
10 Incident Number 11-3590027. I'm here, sir, just if you
11 can, just if you can go back to the Christmas Eve of 2011,
12 December 24, 2011, and tell me to the best of your
13 recollection everything that was going on that day, or when
14 Miss Cox arrived at your house, and also Mr. Walker.

15 MICHAEL PERKINS: All right. Oh, talk to you?

16 DETECTIVE THORPE: Yes, sir. You can just talk into
17 the mic.

18 MICHAEL PERKINS: Um, basically, they arrived -- it
19 wasn't dark. I'd say, by that time, it was getting dark
20 early, wasn't it?

21 DETECTIVE THORPE: [Indiscernible].

22 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Yeah.

23 MICHAEL PERKINS: Huh? It was getting dark about
24 6:00, wasn't it; no later than 6:00, right?

25 DETECTIVE THORPE: Yeah, [Indiscernible].

1 MICHAEL PERKINS: Okay. They got here before it got
2 dark, maybe 5-5:30, about 5:30, something like that. And,
3 uh, they come over to have a couple drinks and watch the
4 game with me, you know what I'm talking about?

5 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

6 MICHAEL PERKINS: She got out of hand. Well, what I
7 recognized, she had already been drinking before she got
8 here.

9 So they had stopped by the store and got them
10 something to drink, and I told him to bring me something --
11 something to drink, too.

12 So while we was just sitting there drinking, just like
13 I said, she was already had something to drink before she
14 got here, because he was waiting on her to come to his
15 house before they came over here. One of her relatives was
16 bringing her up over to his house, so I assumed she and her
17 relative or somebody had been drinking before they got to
18 him. Then after she got over here, after they come here,
19 and then they started drinking again here.

20 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Yeah.

21 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. And we was watching the
22 football game, and from then on, after the game started
23 going on real good, you know, I could see Miss Constance,
24 uh, kept going in after, uh, going in and out the house,
25 you know, going back to the car because she had already

1 consumed, mainly, what was in her bottle here, and, uh,
2 Walker, Mr. Walker, he -- I was drinking vodka; they was
3 drinking E&J, but I assume as much as she did while she was
4 here. He don't even drink vodka, but he ended up having a
5 couple drinks of my vodka, and he don't even drink vodka,
6 you know?

7 But I -- we noticed that, uh, she kept going in and
8 out the house, but she went out there to get more drinks
9 and drinking beer, too. And I was saying, "What she keep
10 going out there for," you know, and keep drinking.

11 Finally, we found out she was drinking beer and coming
12 back in the house, you know, drinking more, you know what
13 I'm saying?

14 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

15 MICHAEL PERKINS: And it just got really belligerent,
16 man, you know, she just got all out of hand, you know. So
17 I told her, I said maybe if I feed her something, maybe she
18 might cool down, you know what I'm saying?

19 DETECTIVE THORPE: Right.

20 MICHAEL PERKINS: So I had some spaghetti, you know,
21 and I warmed up the spaghetti, gave her a big old -- she
22 had a big old plate of spaghetti, man -- and I said maybe
23 she'll cool down by then.

24 Well, she ate the spaghetti and she didn't get no
25 better. And I believe she was doing something else other

1 than, uh, alcohol before she got there. I think she had
2 been smoking some reefer or something, you know what I'm
3 saying? Plus that beer and liquor, you know what I'm
4 saying?

5 DETECTIVE THORPE: Yeah.

6 MICHAEL PERKINS: And, uh, me and Orsley was trying to
7 cool her down because he was intending after the game go
8 off, he was intending to take her back to his house, you
9 know what I'm saying? But she got so bad, he told her, he
10 said, "Come on, I'm going to just take you home," you know
11 what I'm saying? Because they had bought some liquor to
12 take back to the house for the next day, for their
13 Christmas Day, you know what I'm saying?

14 So, uh, but Orsley -- I'm thinking Orsley was taking
15 her home after I told him, I said, "I'm going to call the
16 police, man," because she got bad [Indiscernible] in here
17 and I didn't [Indiscernible] in here and I didn't
18 [Indiscernible]. So I told him, I said, "You can just go
19 and try to take that girl [Indiscernible] and take her home
20 because I'm going to get ready to call the police."

21 It had gotten dark then.

22 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

23 MICHAEL PERKINS: This was maybe two hours after they
24 got here, you know. This was probably maybe two hours
25 after they got here. A good two hours, you know what I'm

1 talking about?

2 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

3 MICHAEL PERKINS: So when I put her out the house,
4 like in the parking lot, I thought maybe she was gone. Me
5 and Orsley stayed on in the house, and, uh, we thought she
6 went on down the street somewhere, but I find out she was
7 next door, knocking on the people's door next door.

8 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

9 MICHAEL PERKINS: I said, "Orsley, Connie didn't go
10 nowhere, man," because I'm sitting right here in this chair
11 right now and I can see straight out the door, you know
12 what I'm saying?

13 When I looked out the door, about five minutes, two
14 minutes later, I see her at my next door neighbor's house
15 knocking on her door. She came back and I said, "Orsley,
16 that Connie, she didn't go down no street. That Connie's
17 standing in front of your car there."

18 So Orsley went out there and tried to talk to her,
19 cool down, and, uh -- oh, this phone right here -- I don't
20 like she got my phone, whether I gave it to her or not.

21 But anyway, I go out there and try to cool her down,
22 too, and, uh, she ran me all around my car and stuff, you
23 know what I'm saying? With her pocketbook. And I believe
24 she put a couple cans of that beer in her pocketbook so it
25 would be heavy because when she hit me, it probably knocked

1 DETECTIVE THORPE: And, uh, today's date.

2 MICHAEL PERKINS: What is it, 2/3?

3 DETECTIVE THORPE: Yes, sir.

4 MICHAEL PERKINS: 2/3, what 12? Uh-huh.

5 DETECTIVE THORPE: Yes, sir. And you also said you've

6 been knowing Miss Connie, Miss Constance --

7 MICHAEL PERKINS: Ever since they've been together.

8 DETECTIVE THORPE: About two years?

9 MICHAEL PERKINS: A little over two years maybe. A

10 good two years, I know.

11 DETECTIVE THORPE: Who is -- who is this?

12 MICHAEL PERKINS: That's her.

13 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. Do you mind signing that for

14 me, also?

15 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. That's her.

16 DETECTIVE THORPE: I just showed a single photograph

17 of Mr. Walker and also the victim, Constance Cox, to Mr.

18 Perkins. He's acknowledged both of those are these people,

19 the victim and the suspect, Mr. Walker.

20 MICHAEL PERKINS: She really just had too much to

21 drink. [Indiscernible] she coming in here and drinking

22 beer and I think she had been smoking some reefer or

23 something, you know what I'm saying? We was all

24 [Indiscernible] together.

25 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Like a combo, huh?

1 MICHAEL PERKINS: Right, and then, uh, and this is
2 right, and, uh, just like I said, uh, he waited, uh, for
3 some other, her family member, to bring her over to the
4 house before they came over here. We was going to watch
5 the game, you know what I'm talking about?

6 DETECTIVE THORPE: [Indiscernible].

7 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. So while she
8 [Indiscernible] with her family member, she had been high -
9 - she got high then probably before she come over, before
10 she got to Orsley's house, and then they come over here.

11 DETECTIVE THORPE: Um, you said she was going in and
12 out of the house --

13 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh.

14 DETECTIVE THORPE: -- or she was drinking your liquor
15 and the beer?

16 MICHAEL PERKINS: Not my liquor.

17 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay, whose liquor was she
18 drinking?

19 MICHAEL PERKINS: Hers. They bought it. They brought
20 it here. They bought mine and his.

21 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. What were they drinking?

22 MICHAEL PERKINS: They was drinking that red whiskey,
23 E&J or something.

24 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. E&J?

25 MICHAEL PERKINS: It looked like she drunk most of

1 that because -- almost drunk up from him because, uh, he
2 had to drink some of my vodka, and he don't even drink
3 vodka.

4 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

5 MICHAEL PERKINS: And he didn't drink no
6 [Indiscernible].

7 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. Um, you said she got
8 belligerent?

9 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh.

10 DETECTIVE THORPE: Can you just go into a little bit
11 more detail about what you mean by "belligerent"?

12 MICHAEL PERKINS: Oh, she throwed my phone up in the
13 tree, too. And, uh, this back right here --

14 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

15 MICHAEL PERKINS: -- you know the back where the
16 battery be? It came off. I didn't find the battery, I
17 mean, you know, the back of the phone until, uh, the next
18 morning because it was dark.

19 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

20 MICHAEL PERKINS: But the phone fell out the tree and
21 [Indiscernible] she threw it up in the tree, so that's the
22 [Indiscernible], and I had to go get the back the next
23 morning when it got daybreak.

24 And I don't know whether I let her use the phone or
25 not, but she had picked it up anyway, you know.

1 So maybe when I told her she had to leave or
2 something, maybe she might have wanted to call some other
3 relative or something to come and pick her up or whatever.
4 I don't know, but I know she went next door
5 [Indiscernible]. And while I was outside, she had me
6 running around the car. And I believe she put a couple
7 cans of that beer in that pocketbook so it would be heavy,
8 probably to knock my head off probably.

9 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay, you said that's when you
10 called the police?

11 MICHAEL PERKINS: Right after that.

12 DETECTIVE THORPE: Twice, correct?

13 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. Twice. And the first time,
14 they didn't come soon enough, and then I called back and a
15 lady police showed up.

16 DETECTIVE THORPE: All right. Did she make out a
17 police report for you?

18 MICHAEL PERKINS: No, she didn't.

19 DETECTIVE THORPE: Um, did you tell her the call was
20 okay and you just --

21 MICHAEL PERKINS: I told her the commotion was gone,
22 all the commotion was gone, and, uh, everything, I guess,
23 was all right by then so I came on back in the house and
24 [Indiscernible] -- I probably watched TV about 10 or 15
25 more minutes and I went on to bed.

1 DETECTIVE THORPE: Do you remember about what time Mr.
2 Walker called you to let him know -- to let you know that
3 he shot --

4 MICHAEL PERKINS: It was later that evening, that
5 night.

6 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay, that night?

7 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh.

8 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

9 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh.

10 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay, um, this will -- this will
11 conclude the audio interview of Mr. Michael Perkins.

12 MICHAEL PERKINS: But I'm sure he didn't intend to
13 kill that woman. I know he didn't because he cared for
14 that girl too much. Like I said, she stayed with him most
15 of the time anyway. She never [Indiscernible] in her
16 apartment, but he was going to take her home anyway because
17 he didn't want to be bothered with her, you know what I'm
18 saying?

19 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

20 MICHAEL PERKINS: She probably -- because they had
21 bought some stuff for the next day, to watch the game on
22 that Sunday, you know?

23 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

24 MICHAEL PERKINS: But I guess he said, "I'm going to
25 take her home tonight and maybe I'll go pick her up again

1 tomorrow or something."

2 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh, let me ask you this question --
3 did she at any point in time lock you out your own house?

4 MICHAEL PERKINS: No, she didn't lock me out. I
5 locked her out.

6 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay, you locked her out? Um, did
7 your stepson let her back in?

8 MICHAEL PERKINS: You know, I can't recall that. I
9 can't really recall that. I can't really recall that
10 because at one time, he was outside, uh, in the car, uh,
11 listening to, uh, records and stuff. Uh-huh. He kept
12 coming in and out, too.

13 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

14 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. As a matter of fact, he ran
15 the battery down in the car sitting out there so long
16 listening to that music. (Laughing).

17 DETECTIVE THORPE: (Laughing).

18 MICHAEL PERKINS: (Laughing). So I woke up the next
19 Sunday morning, go and get me a cup of coffee. My wife is
20 out of town; she wasn't home, you know, for, uh, you know,
21 so she was -- I was using the car to go get me a cup of
22 coffee the next morning. The thing wouldn't crank, man. I
23 had to take that -- the thing back to BMW.

24 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Ah.

25 MICHAEL PERKINS: You know what I'm talking about,

1 Atlanta [Indiscernible] --

2 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Right. Yeah.

3 MICHAEL PERKINS: -- that Monday morning.

4 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. Do you have anything else
5 you'd like to add, Mr. Perkins?

6 MICHAEL PERKINS: Um, I'm trying to see what can I
7 say? Other than I know he didn't mean to kill her, man. I
8 know he didn't mean to kill her. That wasn't him. That
9 wasn't like him. Uh-uh. I think -- I'm almost sure it was
10 accidentally. He probably -- see, first of all, after he
11 took her home, she probably wouldn't get out the car. She
12 wanted to go with him.

13 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

14 MICHAEL PERKINS: You got me now?

15 DETECTIVE THORPE: Right.

16 MICHAEL PERKINS: She didn't want to go home.

17 DETECTIVE BOWERS: Uh-huh.

18 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

19 MICHAEL PERKINS: She wanted to go with the liquor
20 bottles and all that, you know what I'm saying, the beer
21 and stuff, and he just insisted, "You going home," but she
22 didn't -- evidently, uh, they got to scuffling in the car,
23 I think, and, uh, that's what really happened really out
24 there in the driveway, I heard.

25 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

1 MICHAEL PERKINS: And, uh, I almost think she just
2 didn't want to get out the car. Well, he told me that she
3 didn't want to get out the car, and I'm almost sure that's
4 what happened, too.

5 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

6 MICHAEL PERKINS: She wanted to go with him.

7 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

8 MICHAEL PERKINS: But he wasn't going to put with it,
9 because he wasn't drunk.

10 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

11 MICHAEL PERKINS: And he didn't want to put up with
12 her because she was really out of it.

13 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

14 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh.

15 DETECTIVE THORPE: So your personal assessment of Mr.
16 Walker that night when he left here was that he was not
17 intoxicated, correct?

18 MICHAEL PERKINS: No, he wasn't.

19 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. But in your opinion, it
20 seemed that Miss -- Miss Cox, Miss Constance, had a little
21 bit too much to drink?

22 MICHAEL PERKINS: I think she had a blackout, man.
23 You know when you don't know what you're doing?

24 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

25 MICHAEL PERKINS: You know what I'm talking about?

1 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

2 MICHAEL PERKINS: That's what I believe, if you drink
3 so much and smoke so much of that [Indiscernible], you're
4 not in control. You're not in control.

5 DETECTIVE THORPE: Would this, uh, would this be the
6 first time they came over to your house?

7 MICHAEL PERKINS: No, no, they come all the time.

8 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay. Do they both drink heavy, in
9 your opinion?

10 MICHAEL PERKINS: Well, I know she drink heavy, but he
11 -- he don't drink like she drinks. Uh-uh. He never have
12 drunk like she drinks. Uh-huh.

13 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

14 MICHAEL PERKINS: When they come over here, they used
15 to just maybe -- mostly, they'd stay about a hour at the
16 most, a hour, 30 minutes or something at the most. Uh-huh.
17 [Indiscernible], you know?

18 DETECTIVE THORPE: Uh-huh.

19 MICHAEL PERKINS: Uh-huh. They usually don't stay
20 long. Uh-huh.

21 DETECTIVE THORPE: All right.

22 MICHAEL PERKINS: A lot of times when he's taking her
23 home, he go pick her up from her apartment and on his way
24 back up to his house, he might stop by here --

25 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

1 MICHAEL PERKINS: -- on the way because he had to pass
2 through here to get to his house.

3 DETECTIVE THORPE: Okay.

4 MICHAEL PERKINS: A lot of times, that's the way it
5 happened, went on, you know; he'd pick her up and then
6 they'd come through here before he take her back to his
7 house.
