

Page 2

This Addendum forms a part of the contract documents and **modifies** the original RFP documents as noted below:

The following information is offered in response to vendor requests for information and/or clarification.

Are plans to be produced in Micro station (Page 3-16 A.14), AutoCAD (Page 3-42 D.1), or both software packages? **Both**

Is the Schematic design phase described on page 3-27 to be interpreted as the GDOT Concept Phase in accordance with their PDP? **Yes**

Is the Design Development phase described on page 3-27 to be interpreted as the GDOT Preliminary Design Phase in accordance with their PDP? **Yes**

Are the Construction Documents (page 3--27) and Working Drawings (page 3-29) to be interpreted as the GDOT Final Design Phase in accordance with their PDP? **Yes**

Will salary inflation be allowed with each annual renewal of this contract? **4% increase annually**

How many copies of the Cost Proposal are required? Two or five? (Page 3-22 and Page 3-53) **One (1) original and Five (5) copies**

Should a copy of the Financial Information be submitted with the Technical Proposal and also separately in a sealed envelope? Or should it **only** be in the sealed envelope? **Submit Financial Information in a separate sealed envelope.**

In the pre proposal meeting Mr. Slaughter was asked how many projects were pending for assignment to the selected firms. He replied that they were listed on the Public works website. A brief check of the website reveals 8 projects, 3 of which will be completed by GDOT. Are there other projects planned that are not shown on the website and if so what are their descriptions. This information will aid consultants in selecting specialty subs. **For now, use only the information listed on the website. There is no guarantee as to a certain number of projects.**

Page 3

This is on page 26 of the RFP Section: 3

“The consultant shall follow the GDOT’s procedures for identification of existing and proposed utility facilities on the PROJECT. These procedures, in part, require all requests for existing, proposed, or relocated facilities to flow through the GDOT’s Project Liaison and the District Utilities Engineer.”

GDOT requires Subsurface Utility Engineering for the identification of existing utilities. So, do the engineering firms or teams need a Subsurface Utility Engineering firm as part of their team to meet the GDOT requirements?

If GDOT requires a Subsurface Utility Engineering firm in place to identify utilities, then the consultants should identify a firm capable of providing these services for any given task as required by GDOT.
