## Questions submitted for Interpretation and Clarification:

1. Something that was mentioned in the pre-bid meeting was about the way to collect money. Is this completely up to us? Do we need to propose if we have an idea for charging parking when you purchase the ticket or if we want to collect it when they drive in?

Response: Yes

2. If we cannot collect money at the entrances, is there an ideal location that you would like us to?

Response: The potential proposer must provide the County with a plan for collecting monies.

3. Will any parking attendants need to be on hand to help the artists to the correct location? If so then when do they need to be on the property?

Response: No.

4. Will we have access to storage for the securing of traffic cones, flags, tickets, radios, golf carts, etc?

Response: Yes, a storage space will be provided.

5. Will there be a designated parking office for the counting and verification of revenue?

Response: Yes

5. How many shows do they expect to have per year? Is there a breakdown on estimated attendance for each show? For example, 2 @ <1000, 4 @ 1001 – 3000, 2 @ 3000+.

Response: The County is unsure of how many shows will be performed per year at this time. The County anticipates six (6) to ten (10) performances for the 2011 season and plans to engage a promoter/operator beginning the 2012 season.
