




**Fulton County**  
**Approves Property**  
**Tax Cut of at Least**  
**7.3%**

In furtherance to the e-blast Update I forwarded to you last week, I want to update you regarding the action undertaken by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners at our meeting on June 17th. Every year, Fulton County is required to publicly advertise

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the maximum proposed millage rate for the current year. At the Board of Commissioner's June 17th meeting, we voted to advertise the 2015 maximum possible general fund millage rate at 10.911 mills, a 7.3% decrease from the 2014 millage rate of 11.781.

It is important to note that this will not necessarily be the final millage rate that will be applied in 2015. At the Board of Commissioner's meeting on July 15th, we may, in fact, vote to further lower this year's millage rate, depending on the County's mid-year revenue and expense projections for the remainder of 2015.

Although the 2015 millage rate will decline, it is possible that this reduction in your tax may be offset by an increase in your property value. As I recommended previously, anyone who disagrees with his or her assessed property value should consider filing an appeal with the County. My pledge to you is to keep working to make Fulton County more efficient, fiscally responsible, and to improve the levels of service to the citizens of Fulton County.
