
Notes on data:

Concentrations of Childhood Poverty are defined as census tracts for which there are more than 200 children per square mile who lived below poverty level during the past 12 months according to the U.S. Census Bureau, American Communities Survey, 2006-2010 5-Year Summary.

A Food Desert is defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture as a low-income census tract where a substantial number or share of residents has low access to a supermarket or large grocery store.
