PROJECT BENEFITS

The primary benefit of this project will be the increased reliability of process equipment and treatment capability, including improvements to operational and maintenance reliability.

BIG CREEK WRF IMMEDIATE NEEDS REHABILITATION PROJECT

What is the Big Creek Water Reclamation Facility and the Immediate Needs Rehabilitation Project?

The Big Creek Water Reclamation Facility is located at 1030 Marietta Highway in Roswell. The plant was first constructed in 1969 and was most recently expanded in 1991 to its current treatment capacity. The plant is currently permitted to discharge 24 million gallons per day of treated water to the Chattahoochee River under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. The plant's service area is approximately 70 square miles and includes Roswell, Alpharetta, portions of Milton, and areas of Cobb and DeKalb Counties.

This project will enhance the Big Creek WRF by: restoring treatment capacity within the plant, it will replace treatment equipment nearing the end of their useful life, and it will incorporate additional enhancements to improve operational reliability.

SCHEDULE

- Issue Notice To Proceed to the contractor in June of 2014.
- Due to the seasonal and sequence requirements of the project, construction may last until the middle of 2017.

How will the surrounding community be impacted?

Since the majority of this project is equipment replacement, it is anticipated to have minimal impact, if any, on the surrounding community. Construction activities will be limited to the plant site. During construction, trucks will be regularly entering the site to remove old equipment and material and bring in new material and equipment, and every reasonable effort will be made to prevent or reduce nuisances, such as noise, odor, and traffic. The contractor's working hours will be limited to 7 AM to 7 PM during week days. Although no work is anticipated outside of these hours, it may become necessary for the contractor to occasionally do so.

Current Status:

After the County received 5 competitive bids, Crowder Construction, Inc. has been awarded the construction contract and is expected to mobilize onsite in June of 2014.
