Water-Wise Landscaping

As water becomes more limited, water conservation is essential. A water-wise landscape reduces outdoor water use by as much as 50%. Using native plants that are indigenous to our Georgia Piedmont region will require less maintenance and watering once established.



Rain Garden

Rain gardens help preserve streams and lakes by reducing runoff and filtering pollutants including fertilizers, pesticides, oil and other chemicals.
