Special Presentation of the Veterans Service Projects previously awarded Grants

- 1. **Investors Academy** by Montra McKenzie. Program located in SW Atlanta that provides Food, Supportive Housing and Job Training. Additionally they provide on the job training specifically in warehouse skills and assist with job placement for Veterans.
- 2. **Veterans Empowerment Organization** by Alicia Higginbothom: Program received the VSP for the past two cycles. Located in Grove Park which is inside the city of Atlanta as well as Fulton County they are focused on housing Veterans with transitional and permanent housing as well as community outreach. The Rollins Veterans Center has 20 beds and there are 41 apartment units on campus.
- 3. **Atlanta Technical College** by Angela Marshall and Lance Wise.Veteran services is its own department located on the main campus of the college, a member of the Technical College System of Georgia. Over 190 students are serviced through the department including the veterans and dependents. Tuition support is provided as well as transitional housing, jobs, basic needs and retirement planning.

- More than 80% of the grant funds from the first cycle were used for direct services and greater than 85% are projected for this year. Last year 20 vets graduated with degrees or certificates.
- 4. Community Friendship- by Emily Thompson and Patrick Jones: A psychiatric rehabilitation organization that was formed in 1970 and has a branch to focus on veterans through Residential support, Homeless outreach and Supportive Care. Their goal is to reach 34 Homeless veterans per year through outreach and case management by assessing needs in the field and tailoring support to the needs. They provide temporary housing, referrals to substance abuse programs and employment training/placement.
