HISTORY

THE HISTORY OF THE FULTON COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY TRAINING CENTER

The Fulton County Public Safety Training Center (FCPSTC) began operations under the Fulton County Board of Commissioners in October 1987. The initial purpose of the FCPSTC was to provide in-service training for the Fulton County Police Department, Marshal's Office, and Sheriff's Office personnel. Added intent was for the FCPSTC to be a true "public safety" training center, providing specialized courses for the Fulton County Fire Department as well.

The FCPSTC was originally located at 4710 Campbell Drive, College Park, in the basement of the Eastern Elementary School, built in 1935. The space was made available by the Fulton County School Board where the upper level of the school was occupied by an alternative school until 1991.

In April 1988, the Georgia Peace Officers Standards and Training Council (GPOST) designated the FCPSTC as a certified regional training site for Basic Law Enforcement Training. Ms. Jacquelyn H. Barrett was the first certified Academy Director for the Training Center.

In April of 2005, the FCPSTC moved to 3025 Merk Road, College Park, occupying the former shooting venue for the 1996 Olympics. In addition to the training center's academic campus, the FCPSTC owns and operates an Emergency Vehicle Operations Course and the David L. Hagins Firing Range.

The Advisory Board and Staff of the Fulton County Public Safety Training Center are proud to present Basic Law Enforcement certification, Basic Jail certification, Specialized, Advanced, and In- service training to all law enforcement personnel throughout the State of Georgia.

Student cancellation(s) must be confirmed at least (five) 5 working days prior to the course start date. Substitution of students by authorized agency officials is recommended in lieu of cancellation. NO FEE is charged to active Georgia certified law enforcement officers, (only officers with specified courses required by GA P.O.S.T.). Private industry/institutions (if approved) are required to pay \$15.00/per hour for tuition at the time of registration. Tuition for training will vary based upon the number of course hours (in-service, advanced and specialized). Applicable agencies will be invoiced upon registration.

All monies are non-refundable and must be paid by certified check or money order on the first day of class.

As a Regional Academy, Fulton County (FC) provides training to all law enforcement officer(s) on a first come, first served basis.

Student tuition exemption are allowed for:

- 1) All officers employed within the Fulton County Region and identified as actively employed within a State of Georgia public safety agency.
- 2) All Advanced and Specialized training will be available to officers' through-out the state.
- 3) Repeat fees must be paid for all Basic Training classes by student and/or agency.
- 4) Per State of Georgia stipulations, fees are charged to all private Institutions (upon student acceptance).

Veterans Benefit:

Effective August 1, 2019, the Veterans Benefits and Transition Act of 2018, Section 3679 of Title 38 amended to ensure that any individual entitled to educational assistance under Chapter 31, Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment, or Chapter 33, POST-9/11 GI Bill benefit are allowed to attend or participate in the educational training upon proof of a certificate of eligibility for entitlement.

GI Bill education benefits recipients are required to provide the school with official transcripts of previous training for evaluation. Training time and tuition is reduced in proportion to the amount of satisfactory credit from previous training and will be granted at the discretion of the school director.

The policy for VA benefit recipients must reference (Title 38 CFR 21455). The student is refunded the unused portion of prepaid Veteran's tuition and fees on a pro-rated basis. Any amount more than \$10.00 for an enrollment or registration fee will also be pro-rated.

BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT CERTIFICATION COURSE

Prerequisite: An approved GA P.O.S.T form P-2 is required ten (10) days prior to the Physical Agility Test (PAT). The PAT Exam will be administered one (1) week prior to the start of class. Registration is on a first come, first serve basis.

*NOTE: Effective January 1, 2025, to comply with the State of Georgia (Georgia P.O.S.T.) new Basic Law Enforcement curriculum, each candidate registered in the Basic Law Enforcement Certification Training program must complete the entire 809 course hours. This training session will take twenty (20) weeks to complete. After a candidate has completed the program, they are eligible for POST certification and for employment as an entry level law enforcement officer. All students are required to attend Orientation the first day of class at 7:30 am.

Class hours are Mon. – Fri., 7:45 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., unless otherwise directed.

All new recruits will be required by GA POST to pass the Physical Ability Test (PAT) prior to enrollment in any law enforcement academy in the State. All PAT dates will be provided by the agency training coordinator. All Basic Law Enforcement recruits will be required to bring a USB Flash drive for downloading required training materials. The Peace Officers Reference text (PORT) will also be provided in this method.

Academy uniforms must be worn on the first day of class.

BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIRED EQUIPMENT/UNIFORM

- 4. **Solid Navy crew cut t-shirts**, (3) (Worn during Physical Exercise Training, long sleeve for winter classes and short sleeve for spring & summer classes.)
- 5. Pants, Tactical pants, Khaki color (511 or tru-specs)
- 6. **Duty Under Belt, black**

- 13. Expandable baton and baton holster.
- 14. Groin protector and mouth guard (optional)
- 15. Classroom supplies (notebook, paper, pencils, black ball point pens)
- 16. Student may bring his/her laptop and/or tablet to class. Devices must be fully charged.
- 17. A flash drive (USB drive) for downloading required material. The Peace Officers Reference Text (PORT) and Academy Rules & Regulations (ULEAR) provided to students via the flash drive student purchase.
- *All Basic Law Enforcement students will be provided with one (1) navy blue dry fit shirt, and a water bottle. This will be at no cost to the student/department. Any additional shirt the student might want, will be the responsibility of the student to make available at his/her expense.

BASIC LAW AND JAIL STUDENTS

GROOMING

- Haircuts will be in accordance with applicable Fulton County Public Safety Training Center (FCPSTC) standards for uniformed law enforcement cadets. All recruits will maintain a professional appearance according to approved standards for uniformed law enforcement.
- Female recruits will ensure that their hair does not constitute a tactical safety issue. Long hair must be secured to prevent access by an assailant.
- Male recruits must shave daily. Recruits who are unable to shave for medical reasons must provide an excuse signed by a physician or other licensed medical practitioner. After profile is established, hair will need to be according to FCPSTC academy cadet standard.
- No facial hair allowed for cadets.

JEWELRY

- No male nor female recruits may wear wedding bands.
- ♦ No facial jewelry OR PIERCINGS (including nose ring, tongue, etc.).
- No jewelry worn during any training involving physical contact with another student or instructor. (I.e., Control tactics, practical exercises, and/or performance examinations.)

DRESS CODE FOR ADVANCED/SPECIALIZED STUDENTS

- Some courses may require wearing uniforms or special attire. Course catalog or Course Coordinators will advise students if certain clothing is necessary.
- Students should dress in attire appropriate for presenting a professional appearance
- Unacceptable clothing includes, but is not limited to, flip flops, shorts, shorts, shorts, tank tops and tee shirts.

EXCEPTIONS AND INTERPRETATION

 Exceptions to these standards may be granted, on a case-by-case basis, by the Director or designee only.

Supervision Level I is the first of three (3) required courses for GA P.O.S.T. Supervisory Certification. A promotion to a supervisory position is an invitation to enter the world of personnel management. This course will provide newly promoted first-line supervisors with the knowledge necessary to recognize the most

common and costly personnel liability issues confronted in public safety. This course is designed to prepare public safety supervisors to take preventative steps to limit supervisor liability and maintain organizational standards. Topics include Role of the Supervisors, basic planning, time and change management, liability, supervisor functions and organization, ethics, and professionalism.



Tactical Rifle

March 23 - 27, 2026 (40 hrs.) September 28 - October 2, 2026 (40 hrs.)

This course is designed for uniformed personnel armed with a rifle while on duty, or for Special Response Containment Team officers armed with an open-sighted rifle. The emphasis of the course is to train Riflemen, and will include shooting with a sling, shooting from various positions, effects of weather, moving targets leads, safety, maintenance, and liability. Students will engage single and multiple targets from 50 -200 yards, both stationary and moving.

NOTE: Students will be required to participate in practical exercises that will be physically demanding. Practical exercises will include engaging multiple targets, decision reaction, pistol, as well as building clearance exercises.

Students are required to bring the following equipment:

Prerequisite: Each applicant <u>must provide a Writing Sample</u> consisting of a minimum ½ to one (1) full page outlining the reason, they desire to become a State Certified instructor. A clear and approved writing sample must be submitted along with an authorized Academy Registration form prior to acceptance into this class.

The Instructor Training Course (Level II) is for public safety officers who are responsible for instructing Law enforcement personnel and lesson plan development. The course topics range from instructor liability and lesson plan design, to testing and evaluation of learning skills. During the course, students will be required to write an original lesson plan on an approved public safety topic and develop presentation skills necessary to deliver that lesson. Lesson plan topics must be related to a basic training course topic approved by the course coordinators. Successful completion of course, requires satisfactorily completing the preparation and presentation of a one (1) hour lesson plan with 80% or better and passing a written examination with 80% or better.

EQUIPMENT:

Students are required to bring a laptop with Microsoft Office 2010 or newer software and a flash drive to store course material.

ATTIRE:

Dress code is business attire or a departmental issued uniform. No shorts, jeans or t-shirts allowed.

Note: The Instructor Training Course is extremely challenging and will require a great amount of effort on each student's part. It takes commitment and dedication to successfully complete the program.

Advanced Firearms

June 23 - 26, 2026 (32 hrs.)
Shoot-in June 22nd at 8:00am
September 22 - 25, 2026 (32 hrs.)
Shoot-in September 21st at 8:00am

Prerequisite: All applicants must be an employed - certified Peace Officer capable of shooting a passing score of 240 to begin the course.

This intensive 32-hour course focuses on one-handed manipulation and precision, compromised-position shooting, dynamic movement, close-quarters transitions, intermediate/precision shots (50–100 yards), and engaging multiple and reactive targets (including steel). Instruction blends dry-fire work, progressive live-fire drills, timed stress shoots, malfunction clearance under load and much more.

Basic SWAT Training October 12 - 16, 2026 (40 hrs.)

This course is designed for officer who have recently been assigned to a tactical team and have no prior tactical training. Topics will include building approach and entry techniques, door breaching, diversionary devices, team movement exercises, room clearances, dynamic/covert entry, entry weapon exercises, ballistic shield use, close quarters live fire exercises, and use of chemical agents.

Prerequisites:

Must be Certified and Sworn Law Enforcement, Officers will be required to pass the Georgia Semi-Automatic Pistol Qualification Course with a minimum score of 90% on the Shoot-in prior to class. Officers will meet at the David L. Hagins Firing Range prior to class. Officers will be required to bring 100 rounds of ammo for the shoot in. No ammunition will be issued out for the shoot in.

Who Should Attend

Law Enforcement Officers assigned to a tactical team, S.R.T. or S.W.A.T. Team

Special Notes:

Officers should bring with them all clothing and equipment they would have with them during a SWAT operation. This would include handguns, submachine gun or rifle, entry body armor, helmet, ballistic shields, entry tools, flashlights, communication equipment, and chemical agent protective masks. Submachine guns or tactical rifles will be used as a primary weapon system. If an officer does not have a submachine gun or tactical rifle, they should contact the class coordinator prior to class to arrange for the use of a primary weapon system. Also, officers should bring long sleeve tactical clothing as well as personal hydration and snacks.

*Special Note: Officers should bring 100 rounds of desired ammunition to shoot a passing score of a minimum of 90% required to remain in SWAT Class.

Crisis Intervention Training

April 20 - 22, 2026 (24 hrs.) August 17 - 19, 2026 (24 hrs.)

To register for CIT training, you must go to "GPSTC website" (www.gpstc.org) under the Location "Region 3 Fulton SO", 90 days before the start of class. Please remember to consult with your agency's training coordinator.

This forty (40) hour course teaches the participant to recognize the signs and symptoms of mental illness. This course sponsored by the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC) instructs officers on De-escalation Techniques. The student will also learn about Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).





The Georgia Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Program is a dynamic collaboration of professionals committed to ensuring that persons with mental illness and other brain disorders receive treatment, in lieu of incarceration in most cases.

The program includes a law enforcement training component delivered via a 40-hour course curriculum approved by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council as follows:

- Classroom instructional training involving various mental health topics that address mental ill
 ness, developmental disabilities, and addictive disease.
- Site visits to either local emergency receiving facilities, day programs, and/or local recovery facilities.
- Performance-based training involving the development of de-escalation techniques and crisis intervention skills via role=play scenarios.

Law enforcement officer who successfully complete the course are equipped with the skills necessary to respond to individuals safely and effectively with mental health needs and/or in crisis. Upon successful completion of this course the participants will be issued CIT pin.





Field Training Officer

April 27 - May 1, 2026 (40 hrs.) August 10 - 14, 2026 (40 hrs.)

The Field Training Officers Course focuses on training certified officers to become mentors and evaluators for new recruits, emphasizing leadership, teaching skills, and proper documentation. The training covers topics such as generational differences, effective communication, handling trainee deficiencies, and the legal implications of negligent retention, and utilizing the standardized training model. To successfully complete the course students must achieve a minimum score of at least 80% on the written examination and pass a performance examination.

and minimum of two years with your current agency.

Subject matter will include safety, range operation, ballistics, instructor liability, low light firing, semi-automatic pistols, patrol rifle, shotguns, and course of fire development.

- ♦ Each student must possess a GA P.O.S.T. General Instructor Certification
- ♦ Each student must qualify with a 90% (270) on the current State SQC course during shoot-in
- Each student must qualify with an 90% on the rifle entry course during Shoot-in
- Each student show proficiency with loading and firing a pump action shotgun


Advanced Report Writing


