RESIDENTIAL WATER USE ASSESSMENT

Fulton County Public Works is committed to helping our customers conserve water and lower their bills by reducing water use around the home. To get started, please answer the questions in this assessment. Our team will review your answers and provide recommendations on how you can improve your household's water efficiency.

WATERING SCHEDULE:

All Georgians must follow the state's year-round watering schedule, which allows daily watering but prohibits outdoor watering between the hours of 10am and 4pm. During times of drought, other restrictions may be put in place as well. To find out about any current restrictions, please contact your water provider.

CONSERVATION TIPS

Replace old fixtures (toilets, faucets, shower heads): Save water and money by installing high efficiency shower heads, toilets and kitchen/bathroom faucet aerators. Look for the EPA WaterSense label when installing or replacing plumbing fixtures. WaterSense labeled fixtures are tested and certified to perform as well or better than their less efficient counterparts and on average are 20 percent more water efficient.



Check for leaks: Lower your water bill and help conserve water by finding and fixing common household leaks:

- Take a look at the consumption table on your bill and check for spikes - is your water use a lot higher this month than it was last month?
- Check your water meter during a time when no water is being used. If the meter does not read exactly the same after two hours, you probably have a leak.



- Listen and look for drips coming from your faucets and shower heads and tighten aerators or replace fixtures if necessary. Check for pooling water under pipes and rust around the joints and edges.
- Listen for running water in your toilet and conduct a dye or food coloring test. Simply take the top off of your toilet tank and add a few drops of food coloring or a dye tablet to the water in the tank. Do not flush the toilet for 15 minutes. If the coloring appears in the bowl, the toilet has a leak that most likely can be fixed by replacing the flapper or rubber washer. Cheap fix, huge savings!

Control your irrigation controller:

- Inspect: Conduct a visual inspection by turning the irrigation system on to each zone and look for broken or misdirected sprinkler heads.
- Connect: Check connections and joints between sprinklers and piping. Wet or soft spots in your lawn may indicate an underground leak.
- Direct: Make sure to aim sprinkler heads toward your landscape and not the sidewalk. Check to make sure the irrigation heads are not blocked by grass or shrubs.
- Select: Selecting a new controller? Invest in an EPA WaterSense labeled smart irrigation controller.
- Don't set and forget: Adjust your controller schedule with the seasons as needed and don't water when it rains. Make sure you have a rain shutoff sensor installed and that it functions correctly.
