ELECTIONS DIVISION

During the month of June, the focus of the Election Division activities was on the following tasks:

Supplies & Logistics - Polling Locations:

Post-election equipment pickup has been completed. Inventory of supplies is currently being conducted for the November Election. Polling location changes for the November election will be presented to the BRE at the July 14th regular meeting. Location changes to be proposed have been advertised in the legal organ.

Absentee Ballot Drop Boxes:

Absentee Ballot Drop Box placement for the November election is being assessed. Locations will be presented to the BRE at the August 11th BRE meeting.

Advance Voting

Staff supported 30 Advance Voting locations and has reconciled all post-election documents. A roundtable will be held with Advance Voting Managers and Compliance Officers for insight and to discuss process improvements. Staff is attempting to secure 35 Advance Voting locations for the upcoming November Election. Locations will be presented to the BRE at the August 11th BRE meeting.

INFORMATION SYSTEMS DIVISION

May 24, 2022, General Primary/Special Election:

We completed Logic and Accuracy on voting equipment for Advance Voting and Election Day. We introduced a new standard operating procedure for election night reporting to ensure files from all compact flash cards were uploaded to the EMSserver.

System specialists were trained to handle reported issues, assign issues to the appropriate Election Day Technician, and follow up and close tickets on WEBeoc.

WDS Inventory System

Assets were allocated, assigned, and sealed using the inventory system. Details of the procedure are shown in the attached report generated from the project management software.

Election Warehouse Relocation:

Worked with logistics to relocate voting equipment from the warehouse on Wilson Road to the new warehouse on Phillip Lee Drive. Working with the I.T. department to uninstall and relocate security cameras installed at the Wilson Road warehouse at the new warehouse on Phillip Lee Driver.

Election Central:

Information System staff began working with the I.T. department to identify the information technology infrastructure needed at Election Central. The initial effort will involve evaluating the department's current hardware and determining what additional hardware is required. Subsequent stages will include interacting with the I.T. department on our operation and what that entails, meeting weekly with D.R.E.A.M and I.T. department and site visits.

REGISTRATION DIVISION

VOTER REGISTRATION

The total number of voter registration applications we received in 2022 is **74,329**. This number includes voter registration applications received via the Department of Driver Services, the Online Voter Registration portal with the Secretary of State's Office, applications from 3rd party vendors, and applications mailed or dropped off at our office.

As of June 30, 2022, there are **841,038** (**740,385** active and **100,653** inactive) registered voters residing in Fulton County.

In June, the VEO team was able to do the following:

In June, The Voter Education and Outreach Manager focused on training the new Voter Education and Outreach Coordinators, following up with seniors on absentee ballot applications, and recruiting poll workers for the election. Lastly, working with municipalities to participate in citywide events to provide voter education and outreach across the county. To date, the team has scheduled at least two events in all Fulton County Cities except for Mountain Park where we hope to hold an event before the November election.

All Voter Education and Outreach Coordinators are fully trained and were able to serve the department on election day by working as poll workers. Since the June 21st runoff election, the Voter Education and Outreach team has been updating all documents to reflect all pertinent information about the upcoming November Election. Also, the VEO manager contacted everyone that has held an event with the VEO team this year to plan another event for the November election. And reaching out to more senior centers across the county to plan events after the absentee application window opens in August. Most senior center directors request assistance in helping the seniors fill out the absentee ballot applications. The VEO team will continue to contact schools, communities, non-profit organizations, and government officials regarding scheduling future events. We are developing ongoing outreach opportunities with various groups to strengthen our impact in the community. The VEO team will also continue working with external affairs to showcase the excellent outreach work across the county.
