#1- APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chair Allen entertained a motion to approve the agenda as amended. The motion was made by Ms. Adams, seconded by Mrs. Crawford, and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.

NEW BUSINESS

#2- APPROVAL OF ADVANCE VOTING LOCATIONS FOR DECEMBER 2, 2025, GENERAL MUNICIPAL RUNOFF ELECTION:

Atlanta, East Point, Roswell, Sandy Springs, South Fulton

Director Williams informed the BRE that based on the results and Municipal Clerks feedback the listed cities will have Runoffs election on December 2, 2025. She asked the board to review the drafted AV schedule and hours of operation.



Mr. Selby expressed concern regarding the hours of operation, specifically for upcoming elections in 2026.

Director Williams explained that the statewide requirement is 9am-5pm Monday-Saturday and Sundays are optional. She agreed with **Mr. Selby** regarding the hours of operation for 2026. In 2026, the DRE budgeted for 7am-7pm operational hours, Monday-Friday. Other factors for operational hours:

- Expected lower voter turnout
- Funding limitation due to unexpected and unfunded election

Ms. Adams suggested the flyer be updated to remove Friday, to minimize possible voter confusion.

Director Williams agreed and thanked **Ms. Adams** and edits were made prior to posting on the DRE webpage.

Chair Allen suggested the board conduct canvassing of the election material and approve the AV locations thereafter.

Ms. Adams inquired about the GARViS/ Epulse report.

Director Williams explained that all reports are available formatted and sorted by voter and vote method.

Chief Glenn clarified that the Voter Participation Report was from GARViS and Epulse Report was from the Poll Pad.

Ms. Adams inquired about Cherokee and Coweta voters.

Director Williams explained the results for those voters. Fulton processed voters in Mountain Park (Cherokee County) and Chattahoochee Hill (Coweta County).

Director Williams explained the requirements for a person to be a certified write-in candidate, if that process is not followed those votes will be an unresolved write-in.

Ms. Crawford asked will the Ballot Canvas Summary (BCS) report be posted.

Director Williams confirmed the Ballot Canvas Summary will be posted tomorrow.

Chair Allen requested Chief Glenn explain to the BRE the discrepancy identified.

Chief Glenn explained the metrics from the election:

Election Day	
Voters Checked-In	118521
Ballots Counted	118519

Director Williams explained that the discrepancy per the election code:

Any discrepancies identified will be reviewed and resolved prior to the required deadlines, to include the reconciliation deadline (30 days after county certification) and the voter credit for voting deadline (60 days after Election Day). SEB Rule 183-1-12-.12(e) O.C.G.A § 21-2-215(i)

Madam Director explained this was a voter credit issue not a vote cast issue.

Ms. Adams asked about the check-in and the list of voters

Director Williams explained that per SOS directives, the voters that voted during the extended hour for the City of Atlanta were not allowed to check-in via the poll pads, they were checked-in using the emergency voting procedure.

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Ms. Adams asked how far off was the discrepancy.

Director Williams explained that the discrepancy was **2** votes in the City of Atlanta during the extended hour of voting.

Chair Allen shared that there was list on the computers of Provisionals voters.

Mr. Selby asked did this impacted any of the election results.

Director Williams responded no.

Chair Allen entertained a motion to approve the listed AV location. The motion was made by **Mrs. Crawford**, seconded by **Ms. Adams**, and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.
