#1– APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chairperson Cooney entertained a motion to approve the agenda. The motion was made by Mr. Wingate, seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.

#2– COMMUNICATIONS AND PUBLIC RESPONSE

Garland Favorito expressed concerns about the mail in ballot process and the accuracy and the adjudication process on Dominion voting equipment. (Handout provided)

Ms. Nuriddin requested the Board to allow another public comment.

Chairperson Cooney communicated the Public comments rules.

<u>A motion to waive the rules on public comment, was made Ms. Nuriddin, seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.</u>

Khadijah Abdur-Rahman, Commissioner Elect, District 6, communicated understanding the undertaking of this election and the Global Pandemic. Ms. Abdur-Rahman expressed reviewing all scenarios to devise a plan to ensure a better outcome for the August 11th Runoff Election.

NEW BUSINESS

#3- OVERVIEW OF THE JUNE 9, 2020, GENERAL PRIMARY& SPECIAL ELECTION

Mr. Barron expressed the frustration of the department, you are unhappy, and we are unsatisfied with how the election went. We are working hard to make sure what happened in the Primary has no repeat performance. **Mr. Barron** explained that most of the decisions the **DRE** made were at the height of the Global Pandemic.

Mr. Barron recapped the Election Day, June 9th 2020

- 10 Polling locations opened late
- Absentee By Mail Process, via email submission
- Polling Precinct Changes
 - Notice of Polling Place Changes
- Equipment Malfunctions- BMDs powering down, shimmering, scanner jams and Poll pad issues
- 90 Technician in the field and roving
- Federal candidates: all provisional ballots will be counted on Friday, June 12th.
- Absentee By Mail (ABM) and total votes cast

Corrective Measures:

- EV Locations normal allotment would be at least 20 locations
- IT to create an effective mechanism for completing Absentee Ballot requests and the DRE requested that the SOS
 create an online portal
- Implored Tech savvy poll voters to apply and become poll workers
