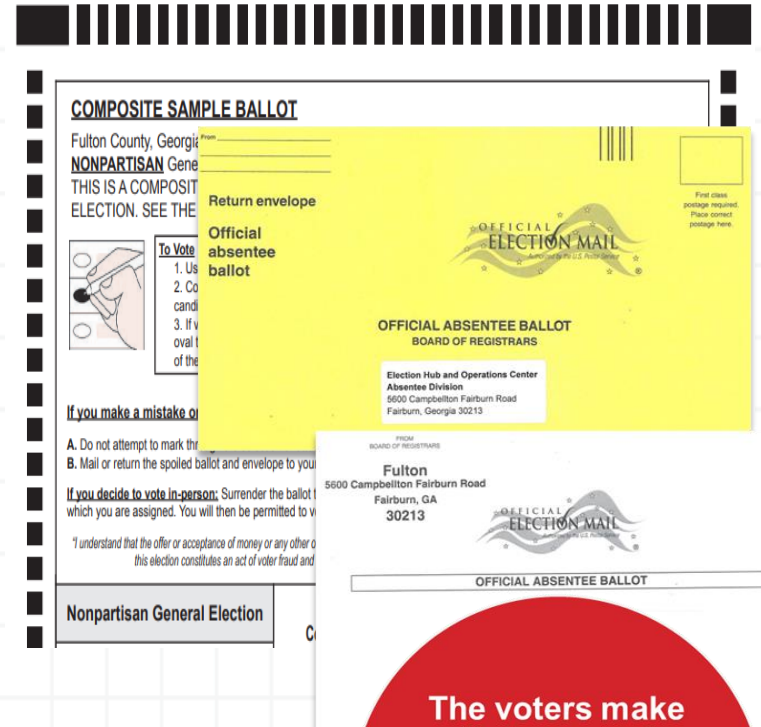

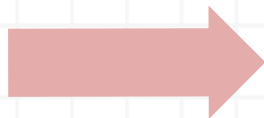
WHERE DOES MY BALLOT GO?



The ballots are scanned into ICP Scanners.

BMD printed ballots are scanned by the voter at the polling location

Absentee by Mail ballots and provisional ballots are scanned by Registrars at the Elections Hub

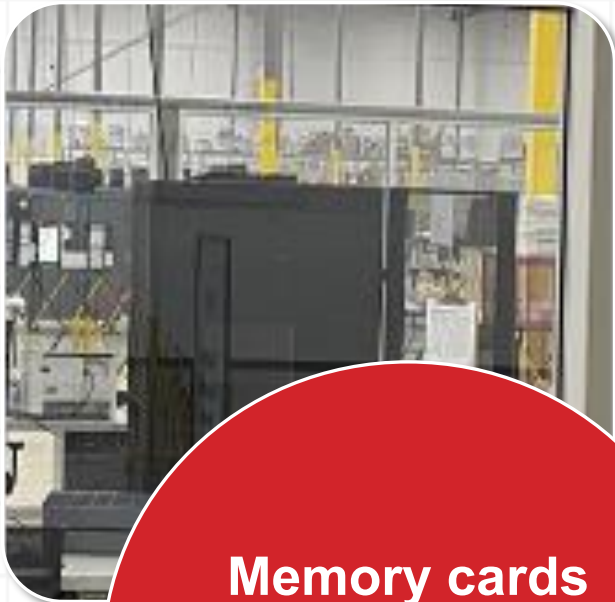


The votes cast on the ballots are saved on memory cards located inside of the ICP scanner

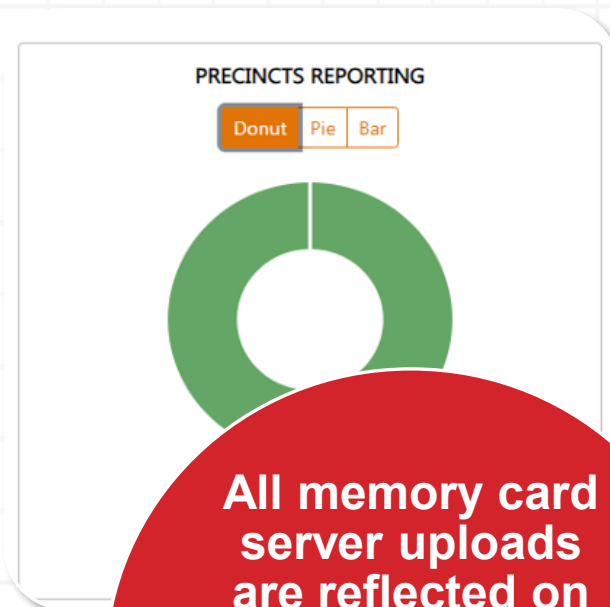

To Vote

1. Use Black or Blue Ink to mark the ballot.
2. Completely fill in the empty oval to the left of the candidate name or choice in all races you wish to vote.
3. If voting for a Write-In candidate, completely fill in the oval to the left of the Write-In selection. Then write the name of the Write-In candidate in the space provided.

WARNING

Do NOT use red ink or felt tip pen to mark ballot
Do NOT circle, underline or mark through choices
Do NOT use check marks or X to mark ballot
Do NOT mark more choices per race than allowed

If you make a mistake or change your mind on a ballot, you must follow the instructions below:

A. Do not attempt to mark through the selection or attempt to erase the mark.
B. Mail or return the spoiled ballot and envelope to your county elections office.

If you decide to vote in-person, Surrender the ballot to the poll worker at the location to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a new ballot.

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After an election, physical paper ballots may be used to review or confirm the results that were electronically tabulated and uploaded from the memory cards. The following processes may occur if necessary:

Hand Counts

Physical ballots are manually counted by hand to confirm the vote totals for selected races.

Risk-Limiting Audits (RLA)

A sample of physical ballots, determined by the SOS, is reviewed and compared to the reported results to help confirm that the election outcome is accurate.

Recounts

Ballots are counted again for a specific race when a recount is required or requested under Georgia law by the Superintendent or by a candidate within the required margin

Recanvassing

Ballots may be reviewed or retabulated to help identify and resolve a discrepancy in the election results.

All of these processes are open to public for observation.

After the election is certified, physical ballots are secured under seal and retained with the Clerk of Superior Court for two years, as required.



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Several election processes are open to public observation, including Logic & Accuracy testing of voting equipment, ballot transport, and ballot tabulation activities, recanvassing, hand counts, and recounts.

We welcome Fulton County voters to observe these processes.

Observation hours vary depending on the current stage of the election process.
